1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 The attached document is the Interim Policy on Hot Food Takeaways that require planning permission. The policy seeks to control the location of Hot Food Takeaways and the number in any location, their hours of opening and impact on visual and residential amenity. The other criteria include the proximity of Hot Food takeaways to schools, youth facilities and parks, bin storage and waste disposal, ventilation, highway safety, parking, servicing and turning, accessibility both by public transport and for the mobility impaired up to and into the shop. The Policy also has a chapter on how the policy will be monitored.
- 1.2 Approval of the Policy, Overview and Scrutiny Community is sought to recommend that Cabinet authorise the Policy to be consulted upon for a period of just over 6 weeks and be used for the determination of planning applications with immediate effect. The consultation period would start from 18th June 2009 seeking the views of the statutory consultees, local businesses and residents as well as other stakeholders. The closing date for responses would be Friday 31st July 2009, after which the responses will be collated and considered with the final document being amended where necessary. The Policy will be brought back to Cabinet for adoption and final publication.

3. RISK ASSESSMENT IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 All the issues raised and the recommendation(s) in this report involve risk considerations as set out below:
 - The Interim Policy Statement: Hot Food Takeaways will be an essential tool in assisting the regeneration of Rossendale, keeping the Borough clean and would assist in health and well-being across the Borough. The Policy would achieve this by controlling the location and number of Hot Food Takeaways thereby keeping the Borough's Town Centres vital and viable as well as securing improvements in visual amenity where approval is given. The Policy would assist in keeping the Borough clean through the provision of adequate litter bins and suitable waste management within the proposals. The policy would seek to locate new Hot Food Takeaways some distance from schools, youth facilities and parks. Resisting applications for planning permission where such problems exist would be much more difficult and costly for the Council without this Interim Policy.

4. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

- 4.1 The purpose of this Interim Policy is to set out clearly the Council's policy of where new proposals for Hot Food Takeaways should be located, the density of such uses and the considerations the Council will expect applicants to have addressed in order to make their schemes acceptable to gain planning permission.
- 4.2 The current draft of the document is ready to be consulted upon for a period of just over 6 weeks starting from 18th June 2009 although authority is sought to adopt the Policy for Development Control with immediate effect.
- 4.3 Following the consultation process, all comments will be collated, considered and the final Interim Policy will be amended where necessary with a view to returning the document to Cabinet for final adoption.
