1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To provide elected members with an update on current enforcement action. This report will focus on updating members with the details relating to the current number of open planning enforcement files, the different stages of any enforcement action paying particular attention to any details relating to enforcement notices issued, appeals and details of any court hearings pending for the second quarter of this year.

3. RISK ASSESSMENT IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 All the issues raised and the recommendation(s) in this report involve risk considerations as set out below:
 - The Council has a statutory duty to enforce planning contraventions.
 Failure to regulate in this area will likely result in lack of confidence in the Development Control Service.

4. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

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- 4.1 As of February 2009, responsibility for planning enforcement comes under the Licensing and Planning Enforcement Manager. Planning Enforcement is currently made up of one full time Principal Planning Enforcement Officer, one full time Planning Enforcement Officer and a part time Planning Enforcement Officer who works 7 hours a week. This has resulted in improvements to the way that enforcement action is dealt with and further changes are being investigated in order to implement additional improvements.
- 4.2 The Cabinet has agreed the Council's planning enforcement policy which sets out a framework within which the Council will take action.
- 4.3 Legal Services have devised an enforcement instructions pack which all enforcement officers use. This enables enforcement notices to be issued and served in a timely manner.

5 REPORT DETAILS

- 5.1 The details in this report cover the period 1st July 2010 to 30th September 2010.
- 5.2 It is intended to produce a report at the end of each quarter
- 5.3 Members are to note that there are a number of open investigations from previous months and years relating to contraventions of planning control. The numbers of ongoing complaints currently stand at 161.
- 5.4 Throughout 2009/2010, and the first quarter of 2010/2011, the numbers of open investigations has reduced significantly as follows:
 - Quarter 1 of 2009 260 open investigations
 - Quarter 2 of 2009 200 open investigations
 - Quarter 3 of 2009 190 open investigations
 - Quarter 4 of 2009 168 open investigations
 - Quarter 1 of 2010 134 open investigations
- 5.5 During quarter 2, 65 complaints have been received and 41 complaints have been closed. This includes 31 'roller shutter' investigations that the planning inspector recommended should be investigated in Haslingden town centre.
- 5.6 Members are further advised that there are a number of enforcement notices currently in force from previous months.
- 5.7 Furthermore, 2 enforcement notices were issued during quarter 2 and the details of these can be found at Appendix A.
