## 1. RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 1.1 That the contents of the Report are noted and the Planning Manager is authorised to undertake consultation on proposed changes to the Green Belt and Urban Boundary with stakeholders. This is the first stage in the preparation of the *Lives and Landscapes* document, which forms Part 2 of Rossendale's Local Plan, identifying Site Allocations and Development Management policies.

## 2. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 2.1 The Adopted Core Strategy for Rossendale (2011) sets out the Council's intention to review the existing Green Belt and Urban Boundary as part of the Site Allocations DPD (*Lives and Landscapes*). The Forward Planning team has now considered the existing boundaries in detail, as well as submissions received from landowners/developers via the Call For Sites process, against an agreed set of criteria, and identified a number of proposed changes to these boundaries, which need to be consulted upon with all stakeholders. It is intended that, following approval by this Council, these changes will be formally submitted in early 2014 as part of the Submission version of *Lives and Landscapes* to an independent Planning Inspector for approval.

## 3. CORPORATE PRIORITIES

- 3.1 The matters discussed in this report impact directly on the following corporate priorities:
- **A clean and green Rossendale** – creating a better environment for all.
  - **A healthy and successful Rossendale** – supporting vibrant communities and a strong economy.
  - **Responsive and value for money local services** – responding to and meeting the different needs of customers and improving the cost effectiveness of services.

## 4. RISK ASSESSMENT IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 • Failure to engage effectively with all stakeholders on the proposed changes to the Green Belt and Urban Boundary may delay the progress of the *Lives and Landscapes* document and ultimately the plan may be found to be unsound.

## 5. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

- 5.1 The current Urban Boundary for Rossendale was defined by the 1995 Rossendale District Local Plan, with the Green Belt boundary defined even earlier, such as in the 1979 North East Lancashire Structure Plan. It is considered appropriate to review and where necessary

amend these boundaries. This is in part to correct any cartographic errors (such as where the boundary is shown on the Proposals Map to cut through a house), or where circumstances have changed and the land is now viewed as part of the countryside/urban area (for example, development may have taken place), as well as assisting in finding enough land to meet the Borough's development needs as identified by the Adopted Core Strategy.

- 5.2 Policy 1 of the Adopted Core Strategy sets out criteria to be used in the assessment. These criteria have been further refined with a further short consultation undertaken with stakeholders in March this year. In line with national guidance, as set out in the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF, 2011) it is only proposed to make exceptional, small scale changes to the Green Belt, changes that are not detrimental on the purposes of including land in the Green Belt. The *small scale exceptional rule* does not apply to the same extent to changes made to the Urban Boundary, although significant consideration is given to the criteria.
- 5.3 The Forward Planning team has assessed the lines demarcating on the Proposals Map the current Green Belt and Urban Boundary using a desk-top exercise involving Ordnance Survey maps and aerial photographs. In addition the team used information gathered from the Call For Sites exercise, where landowners/developers/members of the public had put forward sites. All this information was supplemented with site visits to ascertain whether any proposed changes were accurate and reflected actual boundaries on the ground. While a large part of the boundary will remain unchanged, it is proposed in some cases to take land out of the Green Belt and the defined Countryside as well as, albeit less frequently, putting land back into the Green Belt and Countryside.
- 5.4 All of the proposed changes have been assessed against the agreed criteria. However, there are some instances where it is considered that a change may be appropriate but does not meet one or more of the criteria, or else a more detailed assessment is needed (for example in respect of ecological value). Where this is so, this is clearly identified within the consultation documentation.
- 5.5 Members will recall that the Forward Planning team is preparing *Lives and Landscapes* document in three stages, with the boundary review being the first stage. This will enable us to go forward to Stage 2 and identify sites, primarily within the Urban Boundary, suitable to be allocated for specific uses, such as housing, employment, open space etc. Stage 3 will overlap with Stage 2 and will identify Development Management policies to ensure that the scale and design of development throughout the Borough is appropriate and where necessary identify specific measures to mitigate against any potentially adverse impacts (such as providing guidance on materials to be used, building heights of etc). These stages will all be consulted on separately before a final consultation will take place on the entire document. This will then be followed by a formal statutory consultation stage, known as Publication, when stakeholders can tell us if they consider the Plan to be sound or not. As such it is possible that there may be some alterations made to the proposed changes identified in the forthcoming consultation on the Boundary Changes. This may be because of comments received, or further information becoming available, or the need to find additional land for development.
- 5.6 It is expected that the six week consultation on boundary changes will commence at the end of October, and will finish in mid December. The consultation will be widely advertised on the Council's web site and at key locations throughout the Borough. In addition the Forward Planning team expect to hold a number of road shows throughout the Borough to explain the proposed changes to the Green Belt and Urban Boundary and answer queries.

### **CONSULTATION CARRIED OUT**

- 9.1 The Forward Planning team has held a number of Forums throughout the year with Members, community group representatives, developers and partners. In February we discussed the draft refined criteria and asked for comments, and then in July we presented a selection of changes to these Forums and asked for comments, primarily in relation to how the proposed changes were presented. We have also contacted stakeholders to explain the delay to this consultation.

### **CONCLUSION**

- 10.1 This is the first widespread Borough-wide consultation in the preparation of the *Lives and Landscapes* document. Proposing alterations to the boundaries at this stage will rule out some areas from being considered for development, and bring other areas in for consideration. It is, therefore, important that we advertise this consultation thoroughly and present proposed changes clearly, explaining why we think the change is justified. Members will be formally asked to approve proposed changes to the Green Belt and Urban Boundary prior to the submission to the Planning Inspectorate for examination of the *Lives and Landscapes* document by an independent Planning Inspector.
