It has been brought to my attention that there is currently an unofficial taxi rank at this location and that people gather here at night waiting for taxis. This means that at some times of day and night taxis wait parked on South St and Pickup St waiting for customers, but also when all the taxis are all deployed people gather at this location waiting for more to arrive. This tends to happen at night after they leave the public houses in the area—one being located on South St directly next to the development site.

As my role is to design out potential crime and disorder with the development, I was concerned to hear of this unofficial taxi rank due to the implications it may have for the future residents of the development in terms of nuisance, noise and the risk of damage and disorder etc. I visited the site last week and can confirm that there was a steady flow of taxis coming and going on South St, with at least 2 being parked up waiting at any one time.

I feel it is extremely important to tackle this issue from as early in the chain of events as possible. I was hoping you may be able to offer some guidance as to how we could approach this issue and whether it may be possible to

introduce a 'No Waiting' area with double yellow lines and the relevant signage so that when the buildings are occupied, the local police can enforce the restrictions and deal with the problems that arise.



Hello.

Thank you for your email regarding the taxi rank proposals. I was unaware of the current developments. Were you aware of the new housing development at this location? If you require any further plans I can send them.

I would have no objections to the proposed rank at the lower end of South St but I feel that the 2 higher up South Street would have a significant adverse effect on the quality of life for the residents of the new housing scheme in terms of noise and nuisance late at night both from the taxis themselves turning and waiting and also from customers waiting for more taxis to arrive. Two houses on the new site would be immediately facing these ranks and I feel it is entirely likely that noise nuisance would be caused and disorder may result if behaviour is challenged by the residents of the houses.

Furthermore I feel it is essential to look into the need for road markings to deter parking/waiting in this area as there is already an unofficial rank at this location which will continue even if the ranks do not go ahead. The police will be powerless to act on complaints from residents unless parking restrictions are in force.

This is the ideal opportunity to prevent a problem occurring rather than trying to deal with it after the event.

My only concern with the South Street rank is that buses turn left out of the bus stands at St James Street into South Street, heading up towards Pennine Road, etc. If more than three cars try to use the rank, or park too far back, buses may struggle to get out, particularly if there's anything parked on the opposite side of South Street, which there often is, even though there are restrictions in place. I'm not too convinced about the ability of the taxi association to self-regulate this, particularly if not all drivers are members.

Therefore, on road safety grounds, we wish to object to this stand being located. I don't think that moving it further up South Street is an option, either for the taxi drivers (further away from the Town Centre), or for us (a longer available kerb line will only encourage additional vehicles to park outside the designated rank).

The proposal is to extend the double yellow lines that run from the junction of St. James Street on the east side of South Street by 10 metres to cover the existing drop crossing that is required for pedestrians to cross South Street (see attached photo). There is a drop crossing directly opposite and Councillor Eaton confirmed that he has seen a resident in a wheelchair using this crossing point and therefore it must remain. I will arrange this on our next TRO review.

The taxi rank can begin where the double yellow lines finish for a distance of 15metres (3 taxis). On the attached plan the red line is the proposed double yellow line extension and the yellow dashed box is the proposed taxi rank.

Regarding the existing drop kerb for a former vehicle access point into the adjacent land, that can remain as it may assist elderly and disabled passengers into taxis and it is of no benefit to the wider public as a crossing point.
