- The task group invited the Team Manager, Community Wellbeing, Prevention & Early Help, Inspire East Lancashire to the first meeting to explain the new model of service provision and how this would impact on Rossendale residents.
- 5.3 A representative from Young Addaction (formerly Early Break) was also invited to explain their role with clients up to 25 years old.
- An Officer from the Council's Housing Options Team also attended to explain the barriers she faces with members of the public presenting as homeless who have drug and alcohol issues.
