Community Paramedic	It is encouraging to know that the service will continue to be hosted at multiple sites within Rossendale as I would imagine that locality is an important factor in engaging clients.
	From an NWAS perspective, in line with the recommendations of the report, a pathway was developed in Oct 2016 which enables East Lancs Paramedics to refer patients to Inspire via the Lancashire Wellbeing Service (poster attached <i>Appendix A</i>).
Rossendale Citizens Advice (Rachel Whippey)	Thank you for sending this to Citizens Advice. Having looked at the notes and discussed with staff we reflect the concerns raised regarding waiting times. Having said that I am aware that Inspire have started seeing people at Stubbylee and are still exploring options to extend access in Rawtenstall. The loss of a drop in unfortunately means that those facing addiction will not be able to get face to face support 'in the moment' which may impact on recovery and it is important that services providing addiction support ensure that referral agencies such as CA are included in communication regarding changes in access.
Inspire	Inspire have stated that the report looks fine.
Young Addaction	Young Addaction pasted their comments directly into the Task
