# 8. POLICY IMPLICATIONS AND CONSULTATION CARRIED OUT

- 8.1 An EIA initial assessment has been undertaken on the pilot project and it has been identified there is no disproportional impact and a Full EIA is not required.
- 8.2 As detailed in the report at Appendix 1, the holiday hunger pilot project was developed through the Holiday Hunger Task and Finish Group, and in consultation with the Portfolio Holder.
- 8.3 Consultation with schools took place as part of the development of the project, and many other community and voluntary groups were involved in the development and delivery of the project. Feedback has been collected from families involved in the project, as well as the schools and community groups supporting delivery. This is summarised in the report at Appendix 1.

## 9. CONCLUSION

- 9.1 The Holiday Hunger pilot project was a success and provided vital support for many families who would otherwise have struggled to provide food or activities for their children over the school summer holidays. It was put together at short notice and Rossendale Council is very grateful to the many volunteers and community groups who helped to make it happen and to the people who donated food and provided funding.
- 9.2 Feedback has been collected from parents, volunteers, schools etc. and the project evaluated to inform any future provision.
