# 5. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

- 5.1 The Town Police Clauses Act 1847 laid down the legislation in relation to the licensing of hackney carriages and stated in Section 43 that licences should only be issued "for one year only from the day of the date of such licence" This was taken to mean that a licence could only be issued for a period of 12 months.
- 5.2 The Town Police Clauses Act 1889 Section 5 amended that requirement to;

Licences may be granted for short periods. Any licence may be granted under the principal Act to continue in force for such less period than one year as the Commissioners may think fit, and shall specify in the licence.

5.3 In relation to the licensing of private hire vehicles, the Local Government ( Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 Section 4 states

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Every licence granted under this section shall; remain in force for such period not being longer than one year as the district council may specify in the licence

5.4 Currently, the Licensing Authority issues licences for both hackney carriages and private hire vehicles for 1 year.

During the term of the licence there is a requirement for every vehicle to be MOT and Rossendale tested after 6 months, so that the safety and mechanical integrity of the vehicle is maintained to the highest standards.

- 5.5 Although the 6 month test is a requirement of the licence being issued, it is becoming increasingly obvious that a number of vehicle proprietors are failing to adhere to the condition meaning that passenger safety is being compromised.
- 5.6 Enforcement officers are increasingly engaged in checking and suspending vehicles which have not been tested, and more and more vehicle owners are being referred to Licensing Sub Committee for failing to comply with the condition.
- 5.7 To ensure that the standard of vehicles is maintained to the highest standards, and to make vehicle proprietors more accountable for the condition of their cars, it is proposed to replace the 12 month licence with a 6 month licence for both hackney and private hire vehicles.
- 5.8 The vehicle will need to be tested on each occasion the vehicle is licensed, and this will not be issued without an up to date test certificate. The onus will then be placed upon proprietors to ensure the vehicle is tested, as without that, a licence will not be issued or renewed.
- 5.9 The total licence fee will not be increased to facilitate this change, and will remain at its current level, but paid in two instalments.
- 5.10 To facilitate the change the design of the vehicle plates will be altered to allow the plate to be re-used on more than one occasion. This is achieved by using high impact adhesive date labels to indicate the date when the vehicle is licenced to. This can be changed on renewal of the licence and will reduce the number of plates currently sent for re-cycling.
