3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 provides that decisions and functions may be taken or carried out by licensing committees or delegated to sub-committees.
- 3.2 The full Licensing Committee in Rossendale comprises of eleven elected members, with hearings / reviews of licences taking place before Sub-Committees made up of three members taken from the main Committee in accordance with the 'Scheme of Delegation'
- 3.3 Many of the decisions and functions carried out under the Licensing Act are purely administrative in nature and so this report seeks to underline the principle of delegation in the interests of speed, efficiency and cost-effectiveness.
- 3.4 Section 10 of the Act dictates what decision must be taken by members, and what can be delegated to officers.
- 3.5 Where, under the terms of the 2003 Act, there are no representations on an application to grant a premises licence, club premises certificate or other applications, these matters can be dealt with by officers in order to speed matters through the system.
- 3.6 Although essentially a matter for Licensing Authorities to determine themselves, the Secretary of State recommends that delegation should be apportioned in accordance with the table at Appendix A.
