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4. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

- 4.1 Rossendale needs to ensure that vulnerable people (such as elderly people, people who have been made homeless and domestic violence victims) receive the support they need to live independently or in supported accommodation (such as extra care housing schemes).
- 4.2 To ensure that the Council is properly able to provide a response to these needs, a Supported Housing Strategy has been developed to guide a multi agency approach to providing these services.
- 4.3 This strategy supports Rossendale's Housing Strategy and its subsidiaries:
 - The Affordable Housing Strategy
 - The Private Sector Housing Renewal Strategy
 - The Homelessness Strategy
- 4.4 The Supported Housing Strategy is also linked to relevant local, regional and national strategies, for example Lancashire County Council's Supporting People Strategy.
- 4.5 The strategy identifies the needs for each vulnerable group and maps existing supply of services. The needs analysis and service mapping has used existing literature, interviews with agencies and (where possible) service user consultation
- 4.6 The strategy will also help to inform future bids for funding as opportunities present themselves.

5. SECTION 151 OFFICER

5.1 It is assumed that the recommendations arising from the strategy can be funded from existing budget resources.

6.1 This is an important report in the context of delivering quality services to customers.
