Investigate improvements to the fountain, and the siting of the bench and the notice boards outside the library.  Also weed around the trees to the rear of the library.	Aled Thomas	The benches and notice boards have been installed to the front of the library and the weeding to the rear has also been completed. The responsibility for the fountain lies with the Library Service. An approach has been made to them to help improve the area.

Update on queries taken after the meeting:		
A road sign at the junction of Helmshore Road and St Peter's Avenue is so rusted that residents believe it to be dangerous – can it be replaced?	LCC Highways	Response from LCC: Need to check whether this is a street name plate or a direction sign. If it is a street nameplate then Rossendale BC is responsible. The superintendent for the area is investigating.
Are there any plans to improve the appearance of the roundabout at the top of Bolton Road North which is overgrown and a trap for windblown and other rubbish?	LCC Highways	A local group have received grant funding to carry out planting works in that area ready for next years flowering seasons. Grass cutting is done by LCC but only to provide a safety swathe around the perimeter of the roundabout.
