The authority is looking at Leisure provision throughout the Borough in the light of the current financial situation and various options are up for discussion. This Impact Assessment looks at the closure of Marl Pits and explores how the impact can be addressed. Other impact assessments have been prepared to consider the impact of the other decisions which are being considered as part of the review of Leisure.

Further it is carried out in the context of a new pool being built in the Borough.

As at the end of 2007/2008 there had been 118,157 visits to the facility. An increase from 114,709 in 2006/2007. It should be noted that this is an increase in visits and does not necessarily demonstrate new users or number of customers. Existing users do attend more frequently. However, the PMP survey undertaken in 2006 illustrated that 82% of the Rossendale population had never used Marl Pits.

#### **Key Findings:**

Marl Pits currently provides swimming sessions for 21 schools and 3 swimming clubs from within the Borough. All but one of the Schools can be accommodated at Haslingden Pool. However, it is anticipated, that due to distance factors, some may choose to relocate to Whitworth Pool.

Of the 3 swimming clubs currently operating at Marl Pits, 2 of these can also be accommodated with negotiations required around start times. This may impact on younger children using the classes. However, a Saturday morning alternative could be offered. Further consultation will be required with the swimming clubs.

Comparable disabled facilities are not available at Haslingden to accommodate the special needs of Tor View School and Rays Swimming Club users. Whitworth Pool, Ramsbottom Pool and St. Peters Burnley have Disabled facilities and can accommodate both these groups but the facilities may not meet the needs of these customers. Further consultation will be needed with these groups to explore if these alternatives meet the needs of the customer.

Adult swimming lessons and all other swim sessions provided at Marl Pits i.e. Over 50's Swim, Ladies Only, various Aqua Aerobics/Mobility and GP referrals can be accommodated at Haslingden Swimming Pool.

Adult and Child sessions for pre school children, Children Swim Sessions (3-5 yrs) and Aqua natal cannot be accommodated at Haslingden. However, all could be accommodated at Whitworth Pool. Facilities also exist outside the borough at Ramsbottom.

All the abovementioned can be accommodated when the new facility has been built, however in the short term there may be issues.

Haslingden Pool is on a main bus route with regular service and bus stops within easy reach of the facility. There may be car parking issues into the short term. The Council will be liaising with the County Council to see if a short term solution can be



identified.
