Period of report	23 <sup>rd</sup> June – 22 <sup>nd</sup> July		
Action/progress this period	Since the last update there has been a meeting of the steering group which was held on the 18 <sup>th</sup> May 2009 where it was agreed that the panel by the next meeting on the 4 <sup>th</sup> August would bring forward semi – completed assessments of the work on the following three options, which are:  1) Community Take Over option  D Spencer to look at the proposal of establishing a not-forprofit business made up of local business people and community minded residents (similar to the CLAW model) G Rooke and R Lawlor to look at generating interest from existing using community user groups and groups within the area.  G Rooke and H Jackson to look at the resurrection of the previous MySpace Application and if this could be bolstered through additional support from other agencies such as the Princes Trust.  2) Use of building and land by Private Service Provider – R Lawlor and RBC Estates undertaking soft market testing of the site to garner interest and workable proposals from interested bodies. B Mercer within the Regeneration Team is working with an existing user group in developing and evidencing a business case for taking forward the scheme under a longterm lease.  3) Closure of Building and other regenerative uses. R Lawlor is looking at other options including the potential for development as housing. D Presto Regeneration Team is also working with an existing business who wants to move to the area and could potentially utilise this property.  An internal update meeting was held with the new Chair; Cllr Judith Driver to inform her of progress on the above proposals and to discuss the need and timing of a Public Meeting.
