The New Hall Social Club has been the subject of noise complaints since the initial complaint was made to the Council in July 2008. The complainant occupies a first floor flat at Lomas Lane, Rawtenstall, and is a tenant of Green Vale Homes. The flat is located directly at the rear of the Social Club.

During the period from 31 July 08 and 17 August 08 the complainant had kept a diary log of the noise nuisance [copy attached] which refers to loud music blaring out, car horns blaring, shouting and arguing outside the club, loud music from live band with 25 - 30 people outside at rear of club drinking, fighting and police called, taxis beeping horns for customers.

In August 2008 the tenant at Lomas Lane complained to the Pennine Night Time Noise Service which operates an out of office hours service for noise complaints. The complaint was in regard to loud amplified music coming from the club premises. The Officer on call visited the complainant and reported loud punk type music witnessed from the lounge at Lomas Lane, the noise being excessively loud and in his opinion was deemed to be a statutory nuisance. The noise was witnessed for 20 minutes within the club and 10 minutes outside some distance from the rear door of the club.

During June 2009 a late Friday evening visit was made jointly by officers from both the Council's Licensing and Environmental Health sections to the tenants flat at Lomas Lane. Music could clearly be heard within the lounge with the window slightly ajar and was deemed to be a nuisance. Observations on the same evening at a distance from the club on Lomas Lane itself, was that the amplified music emanating from the club was loud and excessive. This matter was reported to the club during the week following when a daytime site visit was made to the club when both officers from the Council spoke to the Manager of the club who was willing to deal with the noise problem by asking the DJ to lower the volume of the amplified music.

Since that visit, noise complaints have continued to be received by the Council with two additional complaints being made by residents of houses on Bury Road who complained about loud music from the Social Club at weekends.

During August 2009 a late Friday evening visit was made by the Council's Senior Licensing Enforcement Officer who reports that when on the club car park at the rear the noise was excessive from the club from the music being played inside.

It can be noted that the construction of the club does not lend itself to retaining sound within the building. Some windows at the rear of the club are not double-glazed and the roof of the club is of a non-traditional building type with metal cladding to sides.

The Licensing Section report that there are no noise conditions attached to the licence.
