1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of the report is for members to approve the award of Discretionary Relief against National Non-Domestic Rates (NNDR) to various charitable organisations.

2. CORPORATE PRIORITIES

4. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

4.1 In each of the cases listed in Appendix 1 mandatory relief has been granted which covers 80% of the charge for NNDR. The Council may then award a discretionary 'top-up' to cover some or all of the remaining 20%. In these circumstances, where a top-up of discretionary relief is awarded, it is funded 75% by the local authority and 25% from the central government NNDR pool.

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4.2 The Head of Financial Services (s151 Officer) has delegated authority to approve discretionary rate relief up to the value of £2000. The cases listed in Appendix 1 have a value in excess of £2000 and therefore Member approval is required in respect of the cases attached.

5. SECTION 151 OFFICER

5.1 The amounts recommended will be financed from existing budget resources for 2010/11. To date, including the current recommendations, £37,886 has been granted in Discretionary Relief against a full year budget of £45,000.

- 9.2 That Cabinet recommends to Council to increase delegated authority to approve discretionary rate relief up to the value of £5,000 to the Head of Financial Services in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Finance and Resources and that this be recommended for inclusion in the Annual Review of the Constitution.
