Details of Decision and Reasoning:	A recommendation was made by Cabinet on 17th March 2010 that:
	 Cabinet support the recommendations of Overview and Scrutiny that following continuation of the value for money exercise with the Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB), Help Direct and Rossendale Borough Council, consideration should be given to adjusting the funding to the Citizens Advice Bureau in quarters 3 and 4 of 2010 – 2011.

	Rossendale Council, CAB and Help Direct have positively embraced the Overview and Scrutiny recommendation made in March 2010 to explore more effective and efficient methods of working in partnership. This work has been progressing in an atmosphere of positive and proactive collaboration which has resulted in a developing Action plan to achieve efficiencies.
	Due to this ongoing work, it is requested that CAB funding is not reduced this financial year (2010 – 2011) as identified by overview and scrutiny as all organisations in receipt of Grant to Outside Bodies funding are being contacted in order to share the challenges of the Council's Medium Term Financial Strategy. This will result in Organisations understanding that funding may need to be amended to reflect available resources.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To inform Cabinet of the work undertaken since the Cabinet Grants to Outside Bodies determination on 17th March 2010.

3. RISK ASSESSMENT IMPLICATIONS

All the issues raised and the recommendation(s) in this report involve risk considerations as set out below:

3.1 The risk of not evaluating and benchmarking the allocation of the Council's Grant to Outside Bodies against value for money and use of resources principles could leave the Council open to the challenge that they are not working in the best interests of the people they represent.

4. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

4.1 The report takes account of the recommendations of the Value for Money Task and Finish Group presented to Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee. That report was subsequently submitted to Cabinet for their consideration on 17th March 2010 and their recommendation is outlined below.

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 Cabinet support the recommendations of Overview and Scrutiny as outlined in their report at 9.1 and 9.2, and that following continuation of the value for money exercise with the Citizens Advice Bureau, Help Direct and Rossendale Borough Council, consideration should be given to adjusting the funding to the Citizens Advice Bureau in quarters 3 and 4 of 2010 – 2011.

Background post Cabinet meeting of 17th March 2010

- 4.2 Community Grants account for a significant element of Council expenditure. Each year Rossendale Borough Council allocates over £200,000 in grants, operated through two discreet funds, Neighbourhood Forum Grants and Grants to Outside Bodies.
- 4.3 Rossendale Council, CAB and Help Direct have positively embraced the Overview and Scrutiny recommendation made in March 2010 to explore more effective and efficient methods of working in partnership. This work has been progressing in an atmosphere of positive and proactive collaboration which has resulted in the development of a 'Value for Money Action Plan' which will enable efficiencies to be realised.
- 4.4 Throughout this exercise the CAB have recognised that it is prudent to evaluate their own business practices and that the value for money review has presented them with an opportunity to scrutinise their own ways of working.
- 4.5 Regretfully the challenge the Council faces in meeting its medium term financial strategy has not allowed it the luxury of time. As well as internally challenging itself to find c£2 million savings over the next three years the Council has already had to deal with external cuts this year, some examples are listed below:

•	North West Development Agency -	£90,000
•	Housing Market Renewal Funding -	£333,000
•	Performance Reward Grant -	£478,000
•	Planning Delivery Grant -	c.£100,000
•	Community Cohesion Funding -	£63,000

- 4.6 In Rossendale a 1% raise in council tax equates to approximately £56,000 in income. If in 2011 we had set a council tax increase in line with inflation, approx 3%, we could have increased our income by just short of £170,000. This is placed into context when as an authority in 2009 2010 we allocated £188,260 as part of our allocation to Grants to Outside bodies.
- 4.7 We face a very different financial landscape than we did back in March 2010 when the original Overview and Scrutiny Management and Cabinet reports were presented. This report therefore rightfully takes account of the challenges the Council's 'Medium Term Financial Strategy' presents.

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- 4.8 Rossendale Council has identified the need to find c£2million in savings as part of a three year 'Medium Term Financial Strategy'.
- 4.9 In tackling the challenge of identifying this saving the Portfolio Holder for Resources and the Section 151 Officer as part of their 2011 to 2012 budget consultation may:
 - 1. Consider a reduction in the grant allocation in 2011 to 2012 to those organisations in receipt of money agreed in 2009 as part of a three year funding agreement (2009 to 2010, 2010 to 2011 and 2011 to 2012).
 - 2. Consider that no one off grant to outside bodies is given in 2011
 - 3. Consider freezing the allocation of grant to outside bodies for the remainder of the Council's three year medium term financial strategy (2011-2013) in years 2012 and 2013
- 4.10 To ensure proactive consultation takes place the Communities Manager has been asked to enter into immediate discussions with those community groups and organisations that have previously been in receipt of grant to outside bodies money in order that the challenges of the Council's medium term financial strategy are shared.
- 4.11 Due to this ongoing work, it is requested that the CAB funding is not reduced this financial year (2010 2011) as identified by overview and scrutiny as all organisations in receipt of Grant to Outside Bodies funding are being contacted in order to share the challenges of the Council's Medium Term Financial Strategy. This will result in organisations understanding that funding may need to be amended to reflect available resources.

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8. CONCLUSION

- 8.1 We are clearly in a different economically challenging position since the original Cabinet report back in March 2010. The requirement to save c£2million in the next 3 years will require potentially unpopular decisions. Making those decisions will be tough but they cannot be avoided.
- 8.2 The work of the voluntary, community and faith sector is recognised by this Council as being extremely important. The services/projects provided by the sector and the support it gives to individuals and groups across Rossendale is highly regarded. Even at a time when money is tight it should still be possible to find different ways of delivering services. As such the Council looks forward to exploring better ways of working together with our colleagues in social enterprises and the community voluntary sector as a whole.

9. **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

- 9.1 That Cabinet recognises and supports the progress made since March 2010 by the CAB and Help Direct to work towards delivering different and more cost effective ways of delivering services.
- 9.2 That Cabinet continues the present level of funding (£75,000) to the CAB for the financial year 2010 2011.
- 9.3 That contact is made with all organizations in receipt of a Grant to Outside Bodies to make them aware of the financial challenges facing the council and the potential impact on future years funding.
