The Training Centre will offer an opportunity to a diversity of people.

The Vocational Training Centre will link into local businesses and social enterprises to provide work experience. Discussions have already taken place with Bacup Consortium Trust who run the greenhouses at Stubbylee about provision of work experience etc. for horticultural courses. It is also anticipated that there will be some capacity for adult learning.
