# 2. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 2.1 To provide members with an update regarding the Council's bid for Townscape Heritage Initiative funding.
- 2.2 To propose a governance structure for the management and delivery of the project.

#### 3. CORPORATE PRIORITIES

- 3.1 The matters discussed in this report impact directly on the following corporate priorities:
  - A clean and green Rossendale creating a better environment for all.
  - A healthy and successful Rossendale supporting vibrant communities and a strong economy.
  - Responsive and value for money local services responding to and meeting the different needs of customers and improving the cost effectiveness of services.

#### 4. RISK ASSESSMENT IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are no specific risk issues for members to consider arising from this report.

### 5. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

- 5.1 In November 2011 the Council submitted a bid for Townscape Heritage Initiative funding based on the town centre area of Bacup. The bid was to total £50,000 with the Council required to contribute £12,500 as match funding.
- 5.2 It has now been confirmed that this bid was successful one of only two successful bids from the north west region.
- 5.3 This first round pass provides us with funding to develop the scheme further in consultation with the local community and stakeholders and then submit a second-round submission.

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- 5.4 The expectation is that the scheme developed would deliver the following outcomes:
  - Preserving and enhancing the character and appearance of conservation areas.
  - Bringing historic buildings back into appropriate and sustainable use.
  - Safeguarding the character of conservation areas through:
    - o increasing training opportunities in heritage skills;
    - o increasing community participation; and
    - o improving approaches to conservation management and maintenance.
- The bid required specific governance requirements for developing and delivering the project. These consist of a Working Group to deal with day to day issues and a Partnership Board to consider the more strategic issues and monitor progress.
- 5.6 It is suggested that the Working Group membership is as follows:

- 5.7 The Head of Health Housing & Regeneration will have overall responsibility for preparing the scheme during the development stage with colleagues from the Working Group assuming specific responsibilities. A nominated THI Project Manager will become the day to day manager for the scheme during the delivery phase and will regularly report progress, and any issues, to both the Working Group and the Partnership Board.
- 5.8 The Bacup THI Partnership Board will meet quarterly to provide advice and support to the project. Other officers within the Borough Council will contribute as appropriate.
- 5.9 It is suggested that the Partnership Board would be made up as follows:

5.10 The role of the Bacup THI Partnership Board is to support the work involved in the THI development stage and, if successful, to provide advice and guidance to the Rossendale Borough Council, who will promote and deliver the THI scheme on the partnership's behalf, allocate third party grants to individual projects and activities and provide performance management for the programme. It is also likely that some members of the Partnership Board will be more directly involved in bringing additional skills to the delivery team, training initiatives and community engagement.

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- 5.11 There remains a need to identify match funding which would support the second stage bid and the Council is keen to support the match funding requirement. Over the next few months officers will be working with partners and local businesses to identify all available sources of funding to support the programme.
- 5.12 Once this exercise is completed a report with full details of required match funding contributions will be presented to a future meeting of this Cabinet.
