## When deciding where to start on the ladder.

X - Elected member

The simple exercise below can be done with staff, members and community groups prior to a decision being made, to help decide at what level to engage.

- 1. Break the decision down into key parts. For example: The authority needs to save £1.4 million, list every decision under this.
- 2. Explain to elected members, staff and community groups what each stage of the ladder means
- 3. Ask people to place the individual decision on where they think it should go on the ladder, along with an explanation.

4. Collect all the responses together and find the most common level of engagement.
