 - That the age restriction on vehicles which were licensed for use as hackney carriages and private hire be amended to replicate Hyndburn Borough Council which was a lower age limit of under 7 years (vehicles up to the age of 6 years 364 days inclusive can be licensed) and an upper limit of 10 years (vehicle reaching their 10th year are too old).
 - MOT's would remain at every 6 months along with the Rossendale Test twice a year.
 - A community impact assessment would be carried out and reported back to committee, this is appended at <u>Appendix B</u>.
