BUSINESS MATTERS

1. **APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE**

6. HACKNEY CARRIAGE AND PRIVATE HIRE DRIVER LICENCE UPDATE

The Licensing and Enforcement Manager outlined the report to the committee which was to update Members in relation to the financial implications of the decision to increase the length of the driver badges in July 2012 and to seek approval to commence consultation in order to support the Council in delivering its decision by fully exploring the implications of an annual, bi-annual and 3 year driver licence and a review of the administrative processes associated with any changes to the driver licence arrangements.

It was outlined to the committee that the Council was required to make a cut of £1.3m from its revenue budget as part of the medium term financial strategy. In July 2012, the Licensing Committee's decision to amend the duration of hackney carriage and private hire vehicles had a negative financial implication of over £20k.

Statutory Officers comments were outlined in the report.
