2. PURPOSE OF REPORT

2.1 To inform the Committee of enforcement action and issues in respect of licensing matters for the period 1st October to 31st December 2012.

3. CORPORATE PRIORITIES

- 3.1 The matters discussed in this report impact directly on the following corporate priorities:
 - Regenerating Rossendale: This priority focuses on regeneration in its broadest sense, so it means supporting communities that get on well together, attracting sustainable investment, promoting Rossendale, as well as working as an enabler to promote the physical regeneration of Rossendale.

5.6 Taxi Licensing.

- At the time of writing this report there are 418 hackney carriage vehicles and 6 private hire vehicles.
- There are 704 hackney carriage drivers and 8 private hire drivers licensed with this Authority.
- One driver has been suspended during this period after being charged with serious traffic and drug related offences.
- On 4th September, Ilyas Ramzan aged 27 of Flockton Road, Bradford had his application determined by this Committee. He had 2 driving convictions for exceeding the speed limit in 2009 and 2010 and he had also received a further conviction in 2011 for an offence of driving a motor vehicle with excess alcohol and was disqualified from driving for 16 months. The Committee considered that Ramzan was not a fit and proper person to hold a taxi licence. Mr Ramzan, whose DVLA licence was restored on 24th May, had his appeal heard by Reedley magistrates on 18th October where the decision of the Council was upheld. He was ordered to pay costs to the Council of £120.

Complaints:

There have been a total of 4 complaints regarding taxis as follows:

- Sounding horn
- Overcharging
- No door stickers
- Magnetic door stickers/plying for hire in Stockport.

In company with LCC engineers and VOSA, vehicles on contract with LCC were checked on arrival at the following locations:

- 2nd October Cribden House School
- 9th October Belmont School
- 16th October Tor View School
- 23rd October Rossendale School

Operation Spartacus Friday 14th December 7pm-9pm.

- This operation was carried out with police and VOSA. A total of 15 vehicles were stopped and checked. 5 vehicles were suspended, 4 more were given defect notices and one driver was reported for prosecution not having a hackney carriage driver's licence (expired).
- 2. Vehicle faults ranged from defective tyres and steering ball joints, lighting defects, expired vehicle excise licence (September) and no smoking stickers displayed.
