#### 1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 This report presents the Preferred Option Report stage of the Rawtenstall Town Centre Area Action Plan (AAP). This report sets out the purpose Preferred Options Report as apart of the Local Development Framework (LDF) and developing new site specific planning policy for designated Action Plan area.

#### 2. RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 For Cabinet to endorse the Preferred Options Report in order to then publish the document for consultation from 7<sup>th</sup> April 2006 for a minimum of 6 weeks.

# 3. REPORT AND REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS AND TIMETABLE FOR IMPLEMENTATION

- 3.1 The Preferred Options Report has been revised following the consultation exercise during August October 2005. During this period of consultation the Council received information from Lancashire County Council regarding traffic flow simulation and design work, which ensured it is necessary to revisit the overall AAP Strategy, the transport and public realm strategy and a number of the specific projects the document contains. In summary the principle changes relate to:
  - Queen's Square Gyratory
  - Bacup Road

- Pedestrian and Cycle Connections
- Fire Station
- Queen's square Development Sites
- Civic Facilities
- Miscellaneous Sites
- 3.2 Due to the significance of the revisions and the Councils commitment to open and transparent plan making, the amended Preferred Options Report will require an additional Sustainability Appraisal and period of Full public participation in accordance with the regulatory requirements of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.
- 3.3 As part of the consultation process, the Rawtenstall AAP clearly presents all the changes from the original Preferred Options Report and the reasons why following the traffic simulation and representations received during the initial Preferred Options. In addition the revised report will also be published for consultation together with the Core Strategy Preferred Options Report to provide stakeholders and the community with a "suite" of documents to provide comment on and gain greater understanding of the LDF.
- 3.4 It was originally set out in the Forward Plan for the Bacup, Stacksteads and Britannia AAP Preferred Options Report to form part of this "suite" of documents. Following the Issues and Option stage a number of exercises will be required in order for this document to meet the "Tests of Soundness" applied by the Planning Inspectorate. It is therefore anticipated that consultation on this document will be carried out in June 2006.
- 3.5 Following representations on the Preferred Options Report being received, Rossendale Borough Council will prepare the Area Action Plan (AAP) which will provide site specific planning policies for the area designated in the plan. The AAP is then submitted to the Government and will be issued for further a period of consultation for a minimum of 6 weeks. This will then go through a process of independent examination that will be led by a Government appointed Inspector.

This framework will ensure that planning policy and the potential impact on the social, economic and environmental well being of Rossendale will be continually assessed.
