

## Re: Overview and Scrutiny Task Group Report on the Review of North West Ambulance Service

Thank you for your letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> November 2015 and for giving me the opportunity to comment on the enclosure, 'Rossendale Borough Council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee's Task and Finish Group report on the review of ambulance services in Rossendale'.

As requested, I have made some comments highlighted in 'bold' on the report which I hope are of help. There are also some inaccuracies in the numbers quoted which I have corrected and I would be grateful if these can be changed before the report is issued publicly.

Part of their plans include increasing the footprint of our A and E to offer primary care services collocated with our urgent care.
