Phil,

I can't remember whether I replied to this email.

Whilst it isn't in our purview, if you applied the same logic as the fire safety order you could argue that the taxi driver is the 'responsible person' as they're the one in control of the vehicle and equally you could argue that a fayre paying passenger is a 'relevant person' as they are legitimately in the vehicle. Whilst I understand the comment – "Our trade argue the fact that they are not fire fighters and quote the strap line, "get out, call us out", we do not expect business owners to perform firefighting operations, although we do expect them to provide equipment that can be used to effect an escape from the building.

The same logic could say that operators should be required to provide equipment to effect a safe escape from the vehicle in the case of fire. Once this was done, we would not expect them to jeopardise their own safety in order to tackle a fire.

Hope this makes sense. Happy to discuss at any time.

We are not asking them to tackle major engine fires, but to be able to deal with small fires which could easily be dealt with by a fire extinguisher designed for use in a vehicle.

Phil,

An interesting question indeed. In brief, the Fire Safety Order does not apply to:

An aircraft, locomotive or rolling stock, trailer or semi-trailer used as a means of transport or a vehicle for which a licence is in force under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994(b) or a vehicle exempted from duty under that Act;

I suppose there's a technical question underlying this. Does the Vehicle Excise license only apply to the vehicle when it's being driven to and from a fayre? If so, there's a possibility that the act applies. If the VEL applies the whole time, then it certainly doesn't.

This doesn't stop you from including it as license condition, using the logic that fayre paying passengers are 'relevant persons' and the operator has a duty to ensure that they can escape from the vehicle in the case of fire – that would be the direction I'd be coming from.

Hope this helps.
