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1. RECOMMENDATION(S)

1.1 That Council formally adopts the Statement of Principles under the Gambling Act 2005 for the period 31st January 2019 to 30th January 2022.

2. PURPOSE OF REPORT

2.1 To inform Council of the recent consultation and proposed amendments to the Statement of Principles as required under the Gambling Act 2005.

3. CORPORATE PRIORITIES

5. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

- 5.1 The Gambling Act 2005 requires local authorities to produce a Statement of Principles which sets out the Councils approach to licensing premises under the Act. This document should be reviewed every 3 years.
- 5.2 The current Statement of principles expires on the 30th January 2019.

5.3 A revised Statement of Principles covering the period from 31st January 2019 to 30th January

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2022, appended at Appendix A was sent out for consultation between 3rd August and 2nd November 2018.

5.4 Two responses were received from the Gambling Commission and Lancashire CC Public Health.(Appendix B), Both these comments will be included in the revised Statement of Principles

The Council should adopt a Statement of Principles under the Gambling Act to provide clarity and guidance to licence holders on the principles to be applied by the councils Licensing unit when considering applications and compliance.
