2.1 To inform members of the work carried out by the Holiday Hunger Task and Finish Group.

 - A proud, healthy and vibrant Rossendale: our priority is to ensure that we are creating and maintaining a healthy and vibrant place for people to live and visit.

4.1 There are no specific risk issues for members to consider arising from this report that directly impact upon the council, however there is a risk that inaction could result in failure to achieve the corporate priority 'a proud healthy and vibrant Rossendale'.

5. BACKGROUND AND OPTIONS

- 5.1 The Holiday Hunger Task and Finish Group was established and carried out work to investigate holiday hunger in terms of school children in Rossendale. Data was gathered based on recipients of pupil premium and those schools were invited to a meeting, along with other relevant agencies.
- 5.2 The Scrutiny in a Day method was utilised for this Task and Finish Group and a very productive discussion was held. The recommendations were as follows:-
 - 1. That a pilot scheme is established within schools and the community network to look at a constant source of fresh food available to those who require it.
 - 2. This scheme will address the immediate issue of hunger and once established, address hunger during the longer six-week holidays.
 - 3. That although the council is not responsible for this service, it is agreed that officers are able to provide co-ordinating assistance to enable the schools and networks to work together.

- 5.3 Following the Scrutiny Day work has been ongoing to establish the need within the Borough. The Director of Communities and the 2018/19 Chair of O&S attended a head-teacher's meeting on 22nd March 2019 and outlined the recommendations. 15 schools indicated that there was a need in their area and that they were interested in the project. 6 schools have been selected, based on the pupil premium figures.
- 5.4 Further meetings continue to take place with the Communities Team, community networks, providers and volunteers to establish what can be put in place.
