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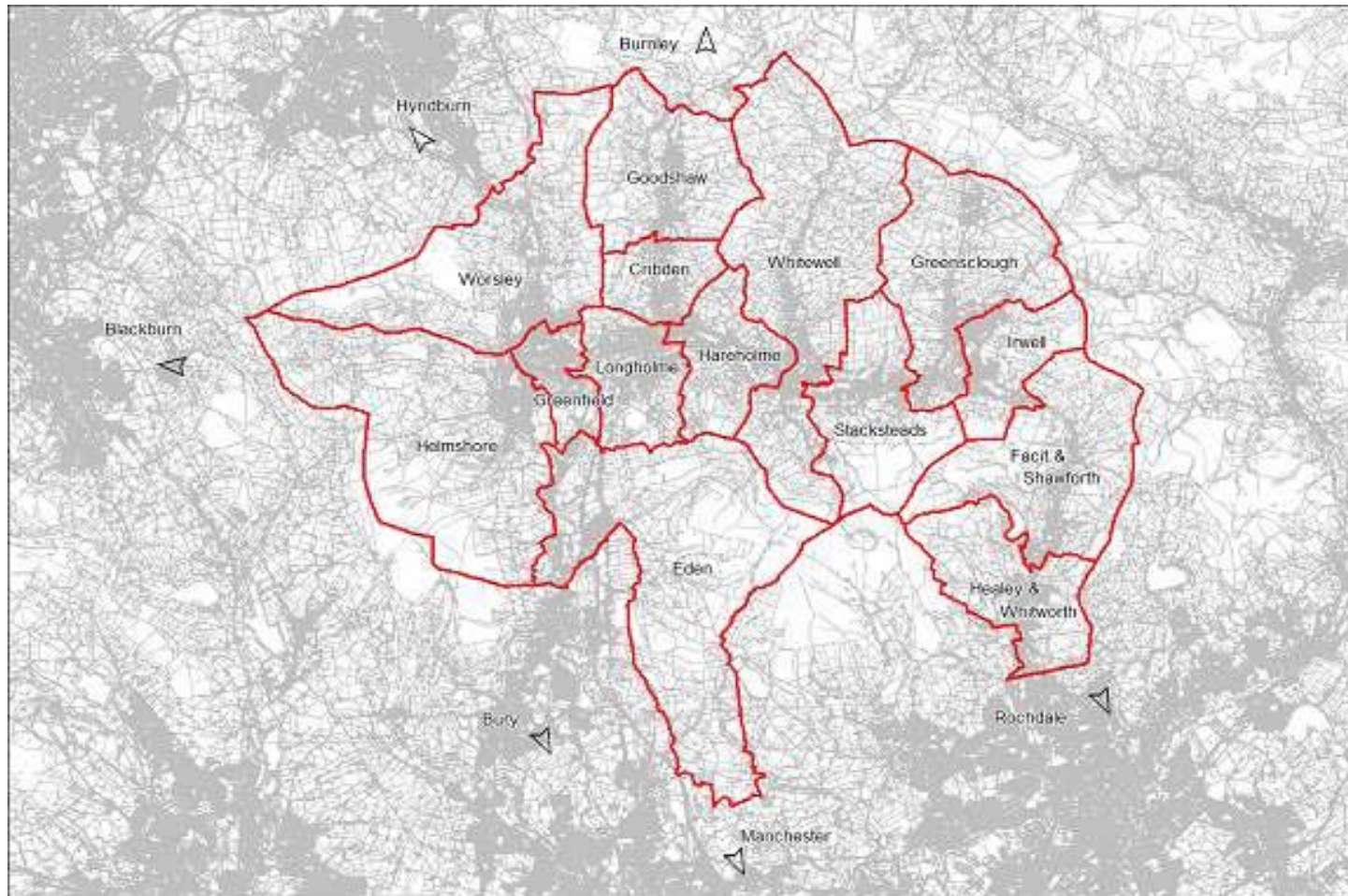

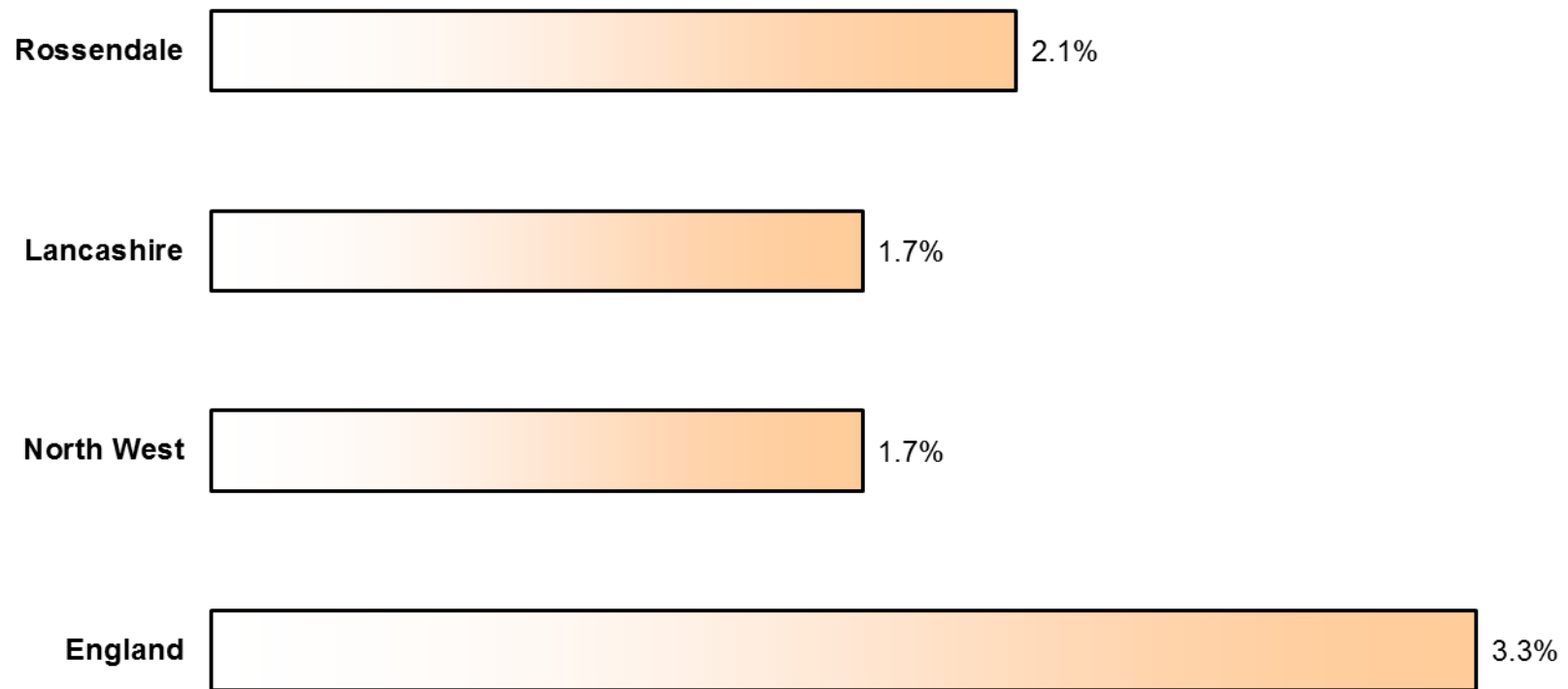

4. Population change

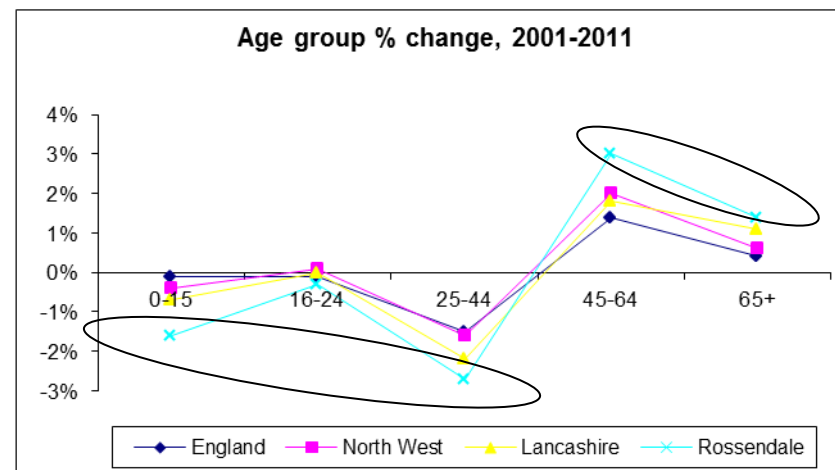
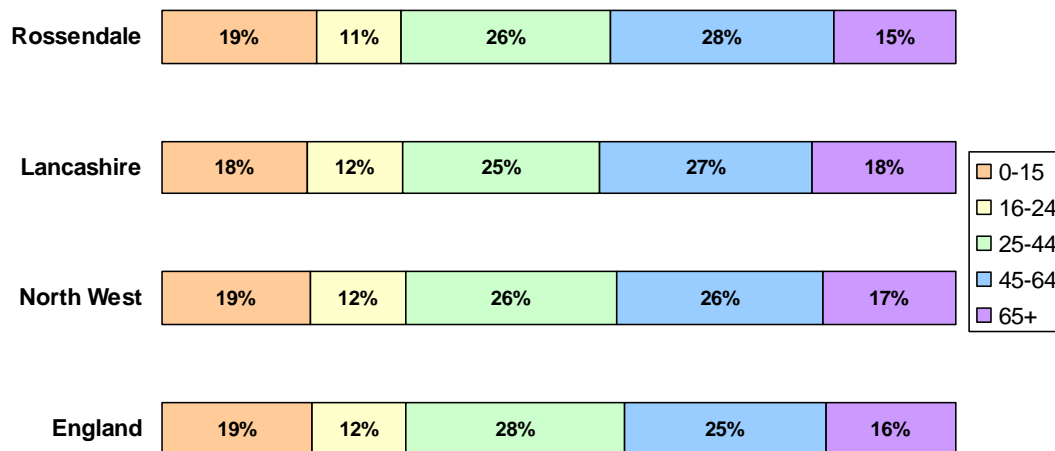
- Population in Rossendale has increased between 2011 and 2015 by 2.1%
- This is higher than the Lancashire increase of 1.7% and also higher than the North West increase of 1.7% but lower than the national increase of 3.3%



5. Age groups

- Average age in Rossendale is 39.6 yrs compared to 40.5 yrs in Lancashire
- The Rossendale age group breakdown is similar to all comparator areas
- But Rossendale appears to be witnessing a larger shift in its age group composition
 - A relatively larger decrease in those aged 0-15 and 25-44
 - A relatively larger increase in those aged 45+
 - Hence, an ageing population

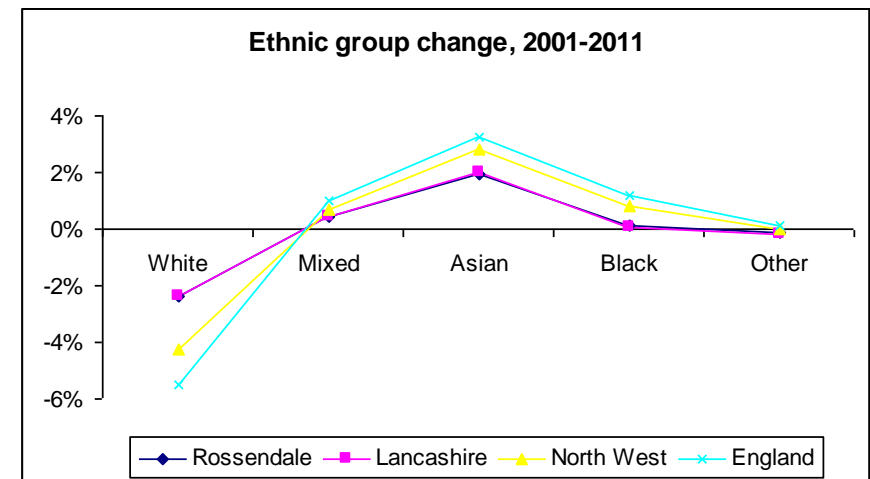
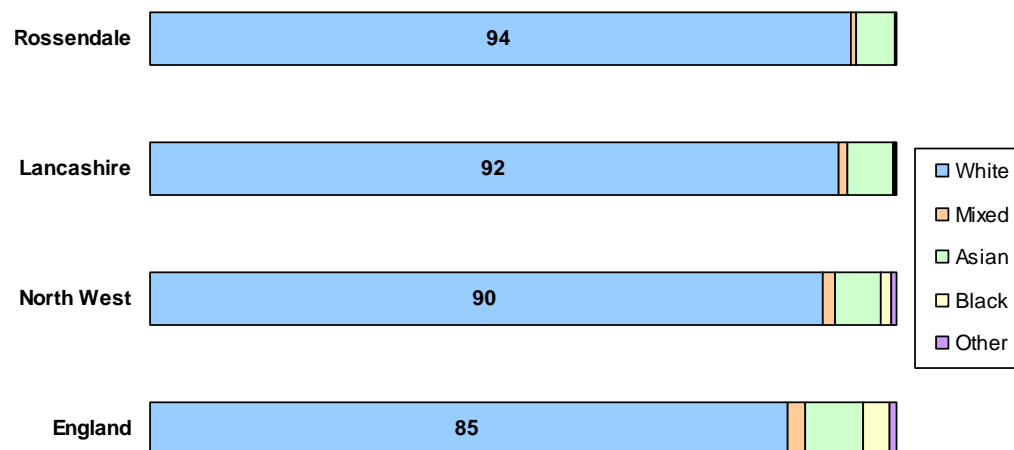
Age group breakdown 2011



6. Ethnicity

- 94% of residents in Rossendale are White or White British
- This compares to 92% in Lancashire and 85% nationally
- Rossendale has an almost identical record with Lancashire when looking at the change over time of ethnic groups
- But the scale of ethnic change in Rossendale is less than in both the North West and nationally

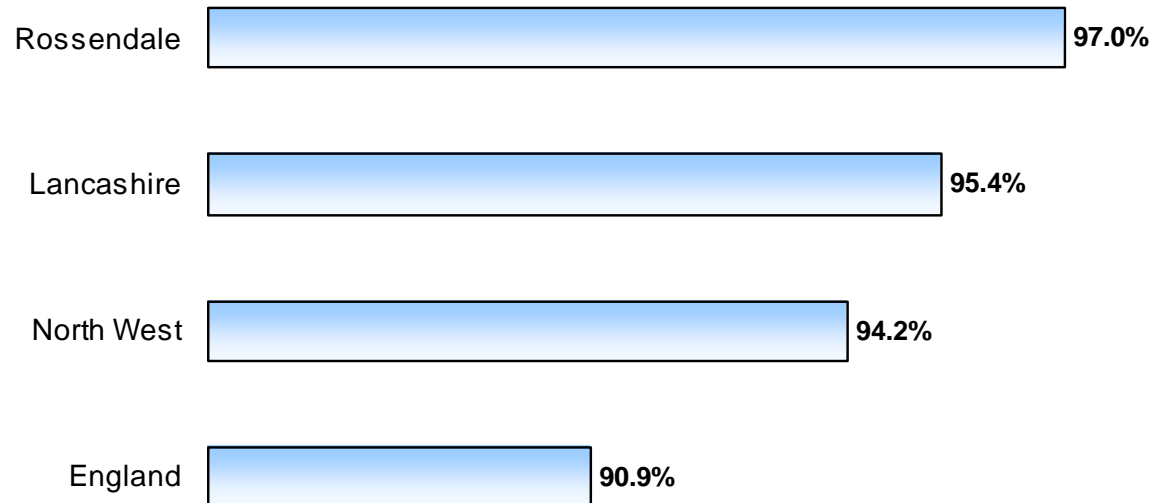
Ethnic group breakdown 2011



7. Language

- 97% of those aged 16+ in Rossendale speak English as their first language
- This compares to
 - 95% in Lancashire
 - 91% nationally

% of 16+ in household who speak English as first language 2011



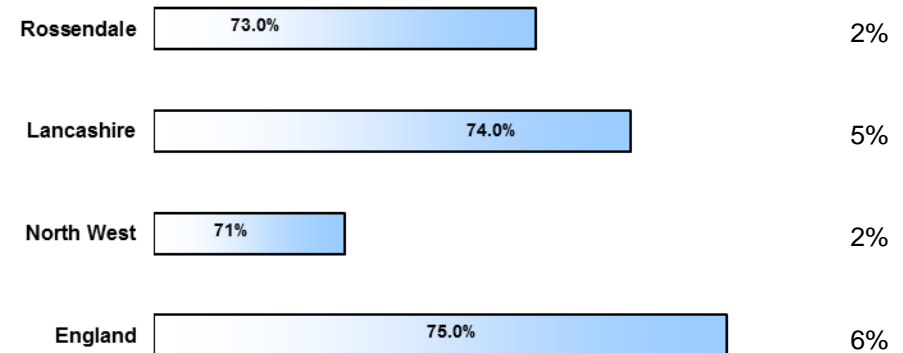
8. Economic activity levels

2015

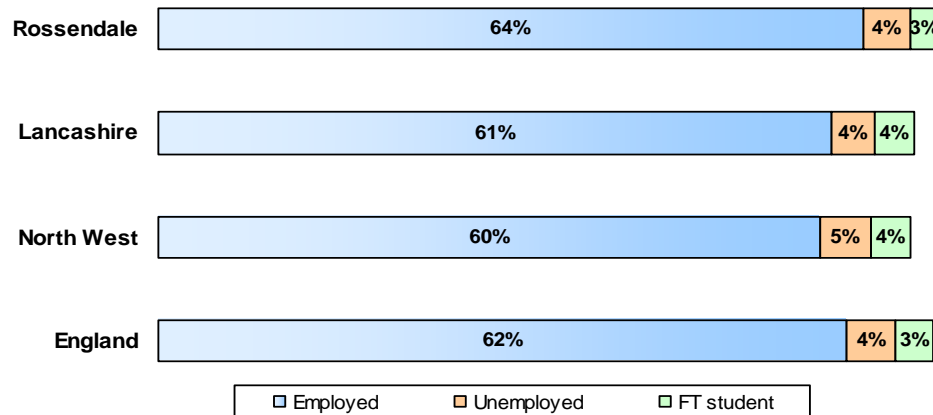
- 73% of Rossendale residents are economically active
- This compares to 74% in Lancashire and 75% nationally
- 73% of all Rossendale residents are employed
This compares to 71% in the North West
- 25% of all Rossendale residents are Economically inactive (24% for the North West)

Economically active residents 2015 vs 2011

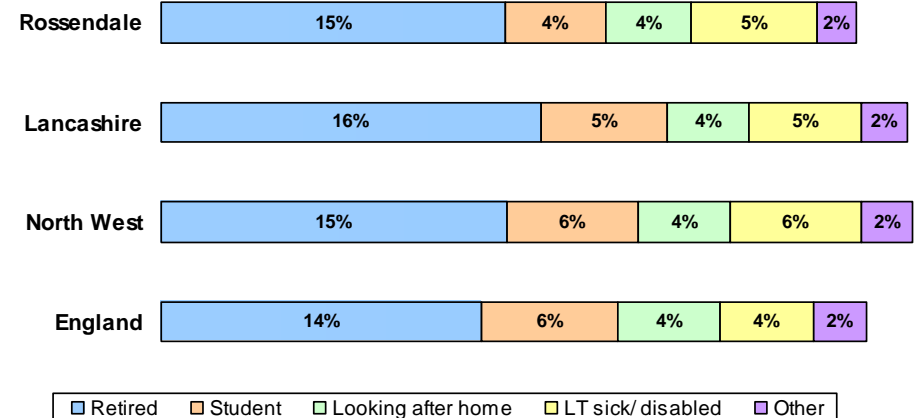
Change vs 2011

Economically inactive residents 2011

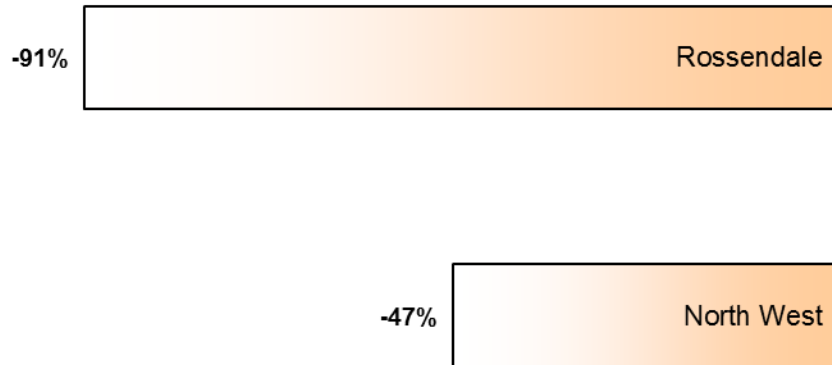


9. Claimant count

- As at December 2016, Rossendale had 845 total claimants
- Over the period between April 2013 and December 2016, the total claimant count has decrease by 42% in Rossendale
- The decrease in claimants compares favourably to that seen for the comparator area

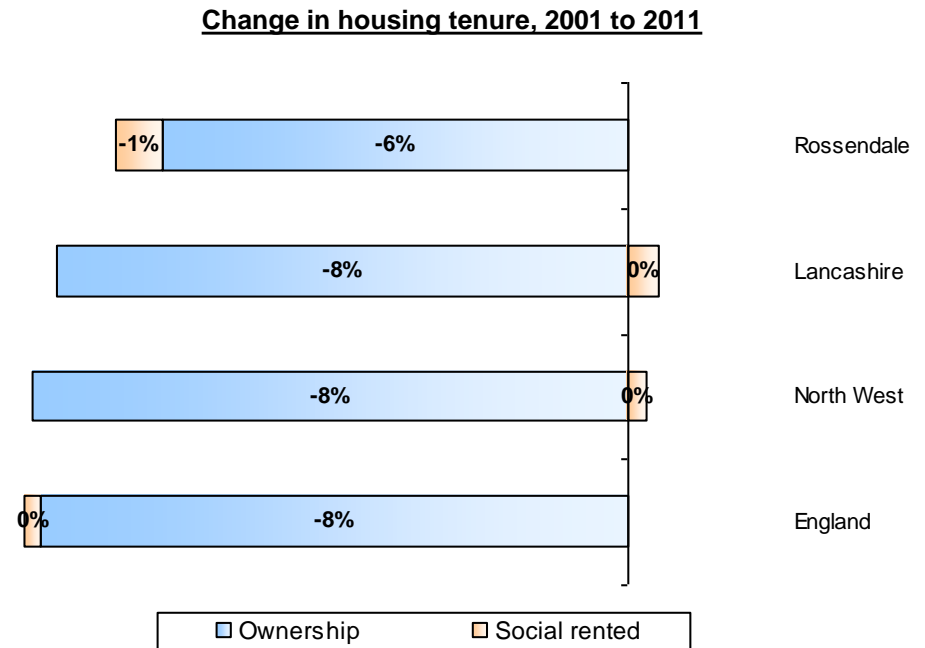

10. Housing - tenure

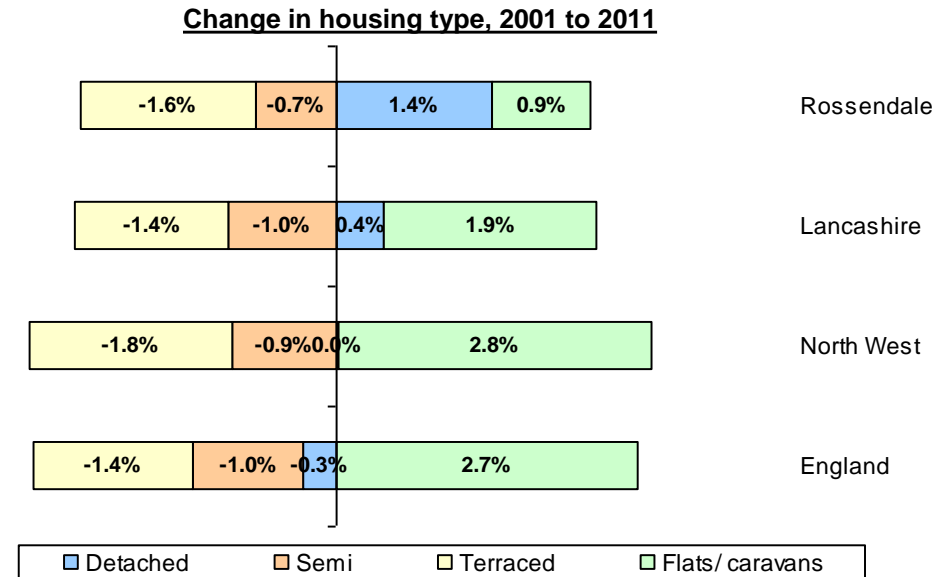
- Home ownership in Rossendale is at 70% (vs 71% in Lancashire and 63% nationally)
- Renting in Rossendale is at 15% for social rented housing and 14% for private rented housing
- Home ownership is consistently falling in all areas and has fallen by 6% in Rossendale since 2001
- This fall is not being picked up by the social rented sector – private rented the most likely alternative to ownership

10. Housing - type

- The proportion of semi detached housing, relative to the comparator areas, is quite low in Rossendale
- By comparison, the proportion of terraced houses account for a relatively large proportion of all housing
- Detached properties and flats appear to be on the increase in Rossendale, whilst semi's and terraced housing appears to be falling

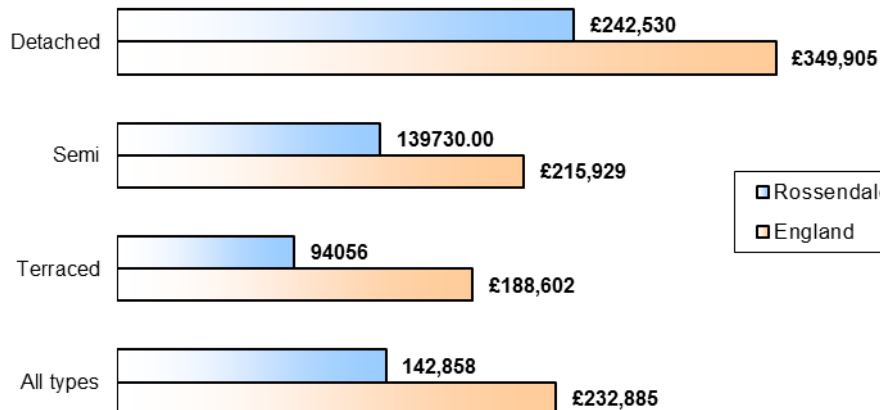

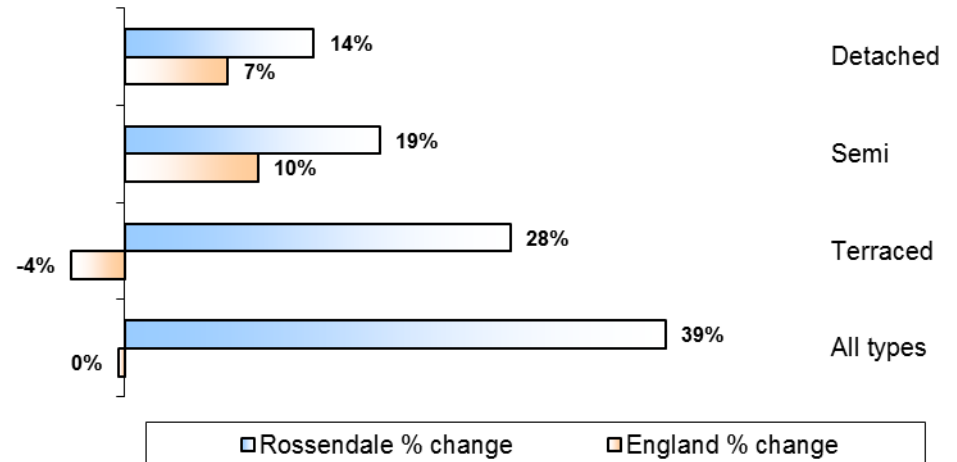
10. Housing - prices

- The average property price for sales recorded in 2016 for Rossendale is £142,858
- Comparing sales in March 2013 to those in January 2017, all house types have seen an increase in price in Rossendale.
- However prices for all property types in Rossendale are much lower in Rossendale than they are for the whole of England.

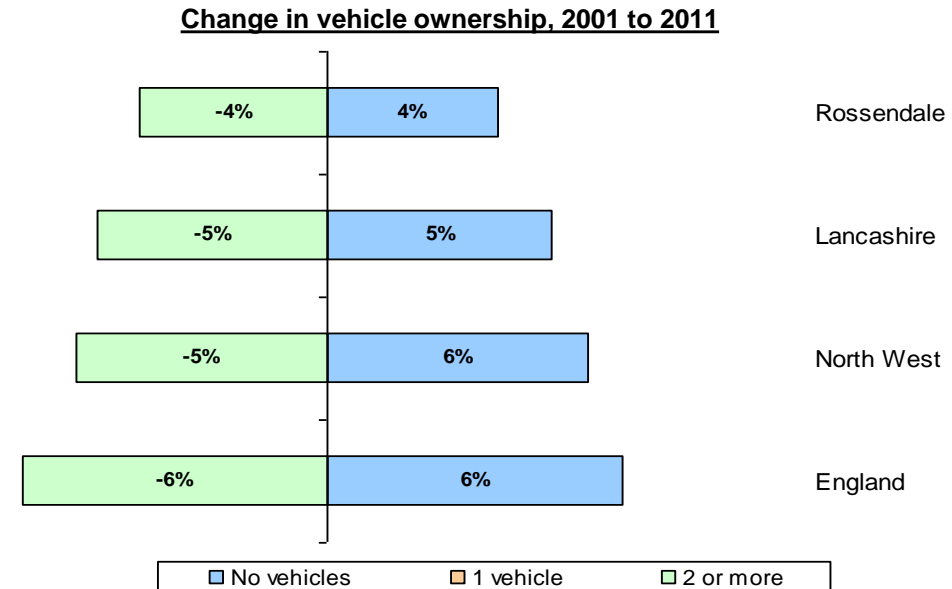
11. Hours worked and income




- Hours worked in 2016 are similar to competitor areas but lower than the national average.
- Pay is much lower than the national average and is among the lowest in the country.

12. Vehicle access

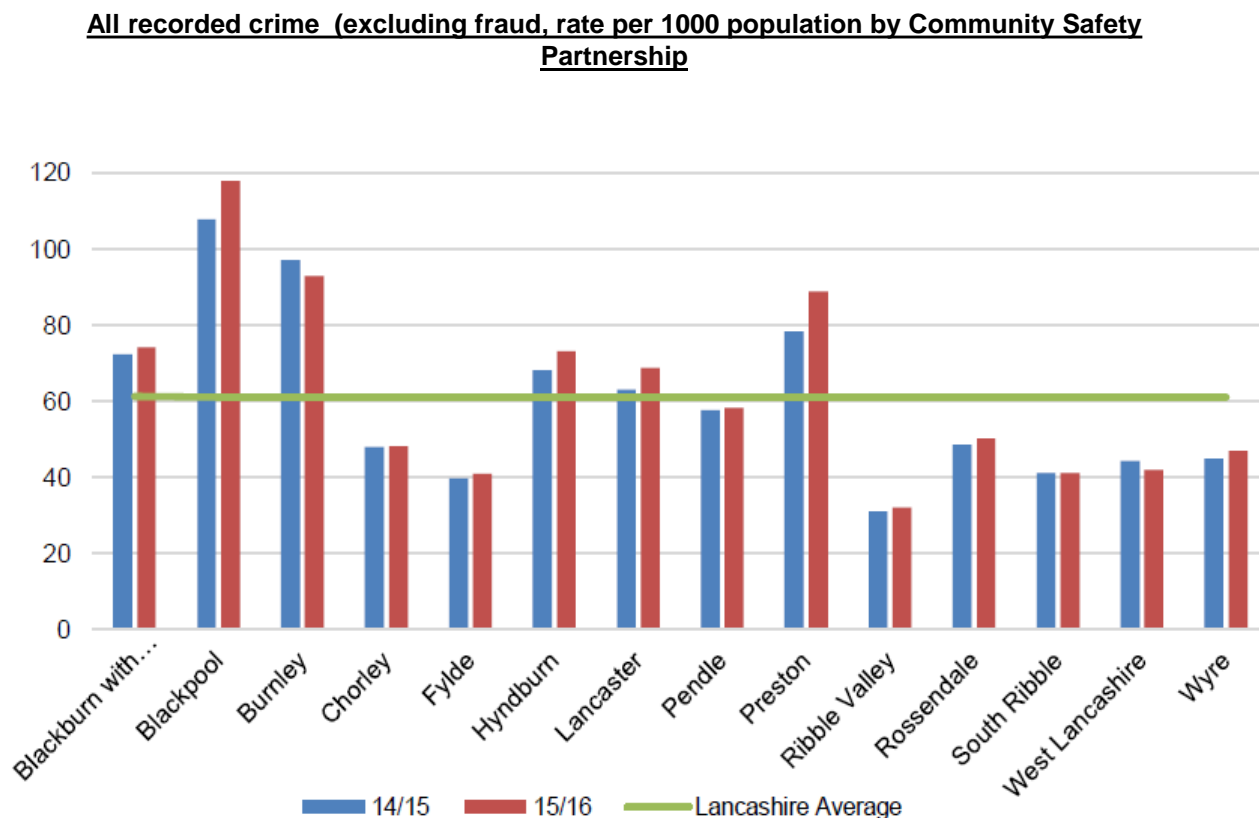
- 35% of households in Rossendale have access to at least two vehicles
- 22% of households have access to no vehicle
- Two or more vehicles within a household is consistently on the decline
- Despite the decrease in households who have access to at least one or more vehicles, Rossendale witnesses the lowest decrease across Lancashire

13. Crime & ASB (2015-2016)

- All recorded crime has increased slightly over the past year in Rossendale.
- Rossendale still has a much lower crime rate in comparison to other Lancashire areas.



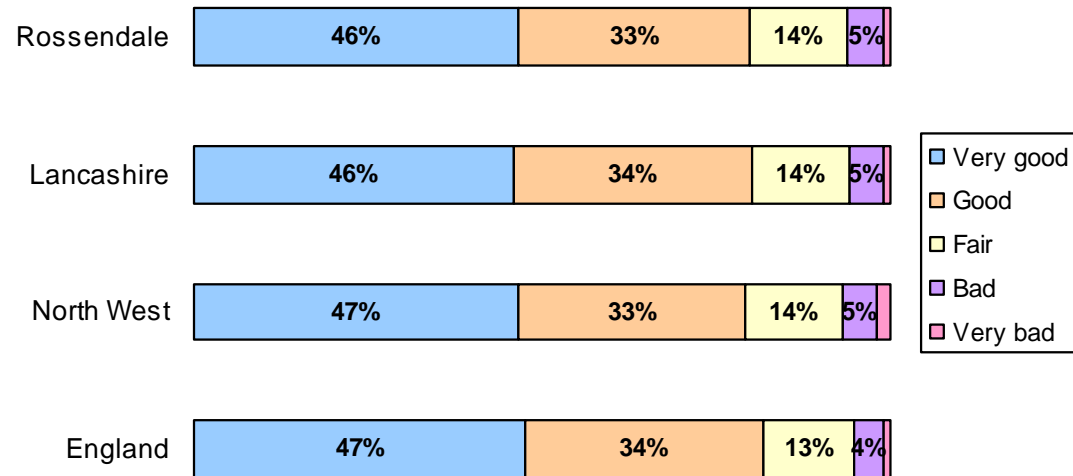
Please note that the scale of some of the crimes does vary. Hence in some cases a small increase in number of crimes can lead to a high % increase.

14. Health

- 10% of residents in Rossendale state that their day to day activities are limited a lot by their health
- 80.1% state that their health has no impact on their day to day activities
- 79% of residents in Rossendale rate their health as very good or good (similar to the comparator areas)

Residents perception of their own health 2011



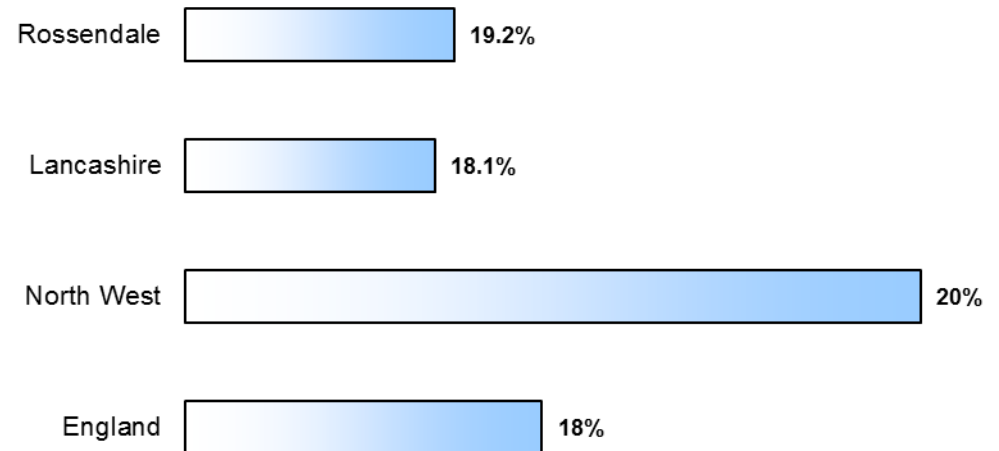

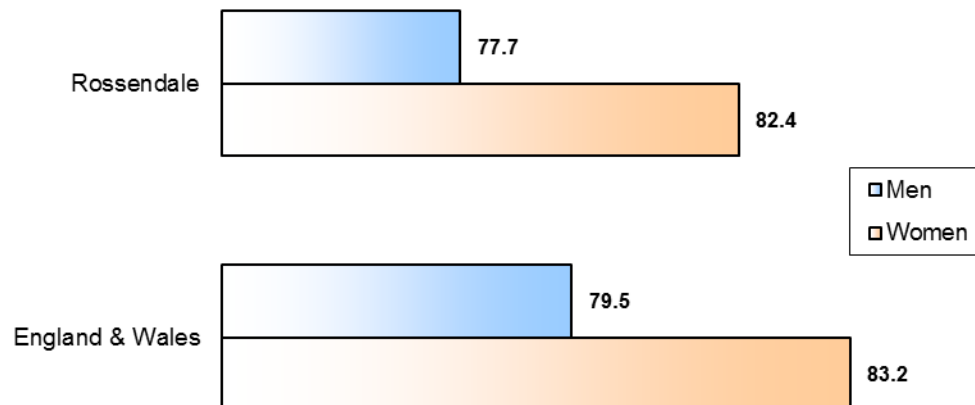
14. Health

- 19.2% of Year 6 (10-11) children in Rossendale are classed as obese. This is slightly higher than Lancashire which is at 18.1%.
- Life expectancy for men in Rossendale is 77.7 years and for women 82.4 years. This is lower than the national average

15. IMD 2013

- The Index of Multiple Deprivation is an indicator tool that highlights areas of relative deprivation both nationally and locally based upon 7 themes
 - Income, Employment, Health & disability, Education & skills, Barriers to housing, Crime, Living environment
- In total there are 32,482 LSOA's (Lower Super Output Areas – areas measured by the IMD) in England
 - Rank of 1 = most deprived
 - Rank of 32,482 = least deprived
- Average rank of Rossendale's LSOAs = 18584.24

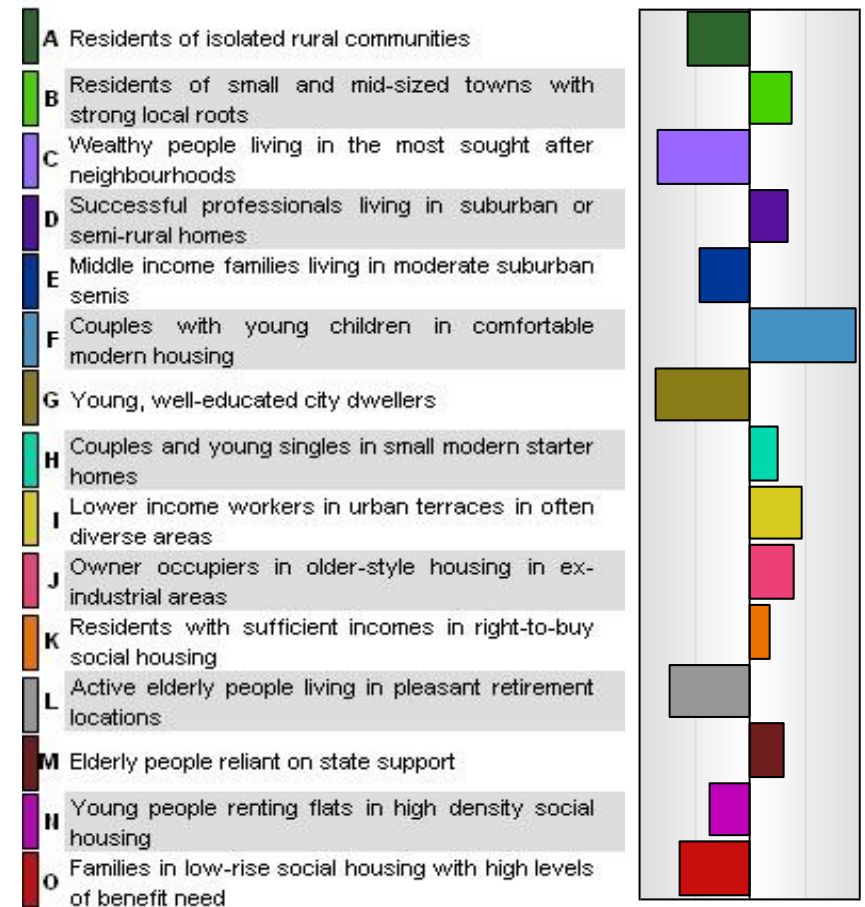
15. IMD 2015

- The average IMD rank for Rossendale is 18584.24
 - This compares to 16730.13 for the Lancashire
- Rossendale outperforms the Lancashire on 5 of the 6 domains
- Weakest performance can be seen for the Barriers domain

16. Community segmentation

- MOSAIC is a consumer classification dataset based upon a variety of demo-graphic data
- The data is not a perfect fit but is deemed to be a reasonably accurate profile based on the latest available information
- The chart to the right details the MOSAIC composition of Rossendale and compares this to the North West composition
- MOSAIC groups F, I and J are above the North West average whilst groups C, G, L and O are well below the North West average
- Anything close to the central black line (i.e. group K) indicates that the group is equally represented both in Rossendale and the North West



16. Community segmentation
