COVID ADVICE

From 17th January:

- People self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative on both day 5 and day 6 and do not have a temperature
- Individuals who are still positive on their rapid lateral flow tests must stay in isolation until they have had 2 consecutive negative tests taken on separate days

From 27th January:

- venues and events will no longer be required by law to use the NHS COVID Pass. The NHS COVID Pass can still be used on a voluntary basis as was previously the case in Plan A
- face coverings are no longer required by law in any setting. Public health
 guidance will remain in place, suggesting individuals should continue to wear
 a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces, where you may come into
 contact with people you do not normally meet
- People are no longer be advised to work from home



OPERATION SNAP LAUNCHED MAKING OUR ROADS SAFER

A secure online portal for reporting and submitting digital evidence

Lancashire Constabulary is dedicated to making the roads of Lancashire as safe as possible and wish to create an atmosphere where people do not drive in a careless or antisocial manner.

They have introduced a secure online portal for reporting and submitting digital evidence of suspected moving traffic offences witnessed by members of the public. This is part of the response to the increasing submissions received from members of the public in relation to safety issues on our roads.

Op Snap provides a real and practical opportunity for members of the public to do their part to help keep their communities and roads safe by reporting unacceptable driving. The material submitted must fit several criteria, which can be found on the FAQ page over on the website: https://www.lancashire.police.uk/public-submission-of-dashcam-footage-faqs/



FUNDING



ROSSENDALE COMMUNITY FUND

The Rossendale Community Fund has been created by Rossendale Borough Council in partnership with the Community Foundation for Lancashire to offer grants to support projects that help families and children & young people engage in community activities and learning.

Applications should enable families and young people up to the age of 25 to flourish, learn and develop skills or knowledge. This includes education, training, sports development, arts and culture activities and also play provision for younger children. Please note that revenue projects and those working directly with beneficiaries are a priority rather than one off capital purchases or refurbishment costs. The panel will also consider projects that are addressing the impact of the COVID pandemic, provided they meet the broad focus of the fund.

Who can apply: Registered charities, social enterprises and constituted community groups. Applicants must have a physical base and track record of delivery within Rossendale. National organisations who do not have a branch in the borough are not eligible. Grants of up to £750 are available

The next closing date is **Friday 18 February 2022 (5pm)** and applicants should expect to hear the outcome of their application by the end of March.



LET'S CREATE - QUEEN'S JUBILEE FUND

Let's create - Queen's Jubilee Fund is a new fund the Community Foundation has just launched

The Let's Create Jubilee Fund will support voluntary and community groups to develop creative and cultural activities as part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations in June 2022. The fund has been created by Arts Council England (ACE) with funds from the National Lottery. The fund will support new creative and cultural activities developed for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in June 2022. The below guidelines provide further information on the fund.

Funding of between £750 and £10,000 is available.

ROSSENDALE CARBON REDUCTION FUND

Rossendale Borough Council has set up a Carbon Reduction Fund to support Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) and Community Buildings to reduce their carbon footprint.

The primary criterion for applications to the fund is CO2 savings per pound spent. The carbon reduction grants are intended to help facilitate projects whose primary aim is to reduce CO2 emissions within the Borough of Rossendale.

Applications who are able to provide a quantitative estimate of CO2 savings that result from their proposed activity will be favoured.

The fund is supported by the East Lancashire Chamber of Commerce (ELCC) who will provide free carbon audit/technical report for eligible charities/community organisations to establish baseline data and advise on appropriate carbon reduction measures.

The fund is for smaller locally based charities and constituted community organisations not registered as a business and which own or rent community buildings.

Local charities and constituted community organisations can apply for between £1000 minimum up to a maximum £5000 per project.

Match funding is not required for charities/community organisations though it may help prioritise your application in our grant allocation.

FUNDING FOR FOOD INSECURITY

We're running another round of the Lancashire Community Food Grant Scheme and it's now open for applications

Similarly to the previous round, this funding is aimed at local organisations within the voluntary, community and faith sector that deliver projects to tackle food insecurity. There's funding in the region of £20,000 available.

Groups can apply for up to £1,000 and the closing date for applications is Sunday 20th February.

TRAINING

Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking (MSHT) Awareness Training

Overview

Hope for Justice is a national and global charity with a mission to bring an end to modern slavery by preventing exploitation, reaching victims, restoring lives, and reforming society. We have a new Lancashire Hub comprising of two Community Engagement Specialists and a Trainer and can currently offer free training to raise awareness in order to help identify, report and support cases of modern slavery and human trafficking within the Rossendale district.

Learning Outcomes

The training will equip participants with knowledge about modern slavery and human trafficking so that by the end of the training they will be able to:

- Explain what MSHT is and identify the different types that exist
- Describe the signs and indicators of the different types of MSHT
- · Respond appropriately respond if a victim of MSHT is identified

Delivery Methods

- The training will be delivered online over MS Teams by Ruth Packwood (HfJ Trainer). Ruth will set up and send out the Teams invitation and supporting document approx. one week in advance.
- Delivery will include national and local facts and figures, polls, case studies, videos and facilitated discussion to explore the subject in depth
- Minimum 12 and maximum 40 participants per session
- Due to the sensitive nature and content of the training, we apply a trauma informed approach to our training so participants will be able to choose whether to have their camera on during the training
- A member of the HfJ Community Engagement Team will aim to be present during the training to answer any specific queries relating to vulnerable people or those at risk of exploitation
- · Participants will be provided with a copy of the HfJ Training Manual and other support materials
- · Participants will be asked to complete feedback at the end of the training
