COST OF LIVING SUPPORT

Help for Households - What people need to know

- More than eight million people on means-tested benefits will receive a payment of £650 this year, made in two instalments. This includes all eligible households receiving at least 1 pence on the qualifying date of the following benefits; Universal Credit, Income-based Jobseekers Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, Income Support, Pension Credit, Working Tax Credit and Child Tax Credit
- The first payment of £326 will be made to households in payment of a qualifying benefit between April 26 and May 25 from July 14, with a further £324 to be paid from September totaling £650. For eligible households on tax credits only, the first payment will be made in the autumn and the second in the winter. Payments will be made automatically via usual payment methods people do not need to contact HMRC or DWP or apply for the payment
- There will also be a £150 payment made to people on qualifying disability benefits which can be in addition to the above due to be paid in September
- There will also be an extra £300 for pensioner households paid as an increase to their winter fuel payment to be paid from mid-November
- In addition to these payments, there is also the Energy Bills Support Scheme which will see all
 domestic energy customers receive a one-of rebate of £400 paid by their energy providers. This
 money will not need to be paid back
- Households liable for Council Tax in Bands A-D in England have received a £150 Council Tax Rebate to help with the rising cost of bills
- And the government has also extended the Household Support Fund until March 2023, providing an extra £421million of local support in England and £79 million to the Devolved Administrations

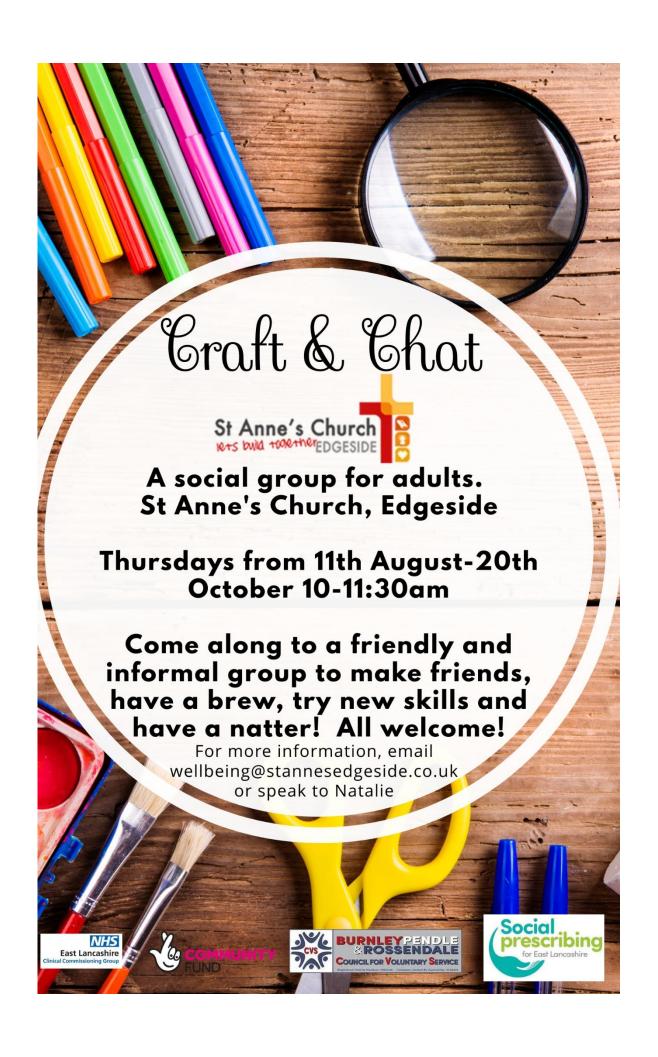

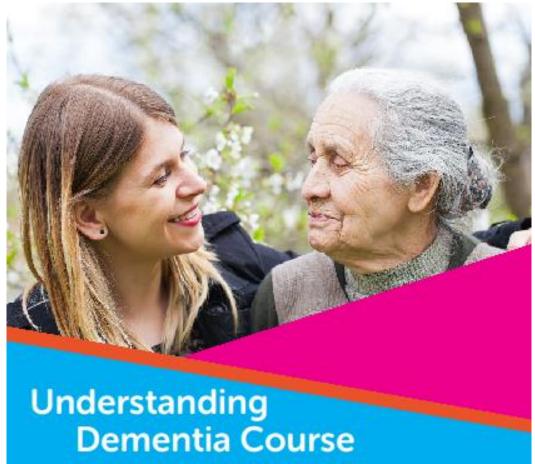

Beware cleaning product cold callers

Residents in Rossendale are advised that a salesman has been in the area, using pushy sales techniques to sell cleaning products at the door. While not illegal, these products are likely to be overpriced, and purchasers will not have recourse to legal protections if the items are faulty or dangerous, as they would when purchasing from a known supplier or local shop. There are also worries that door-to-door salesmen may be trying to find out who lives at a property, and what it is like inside, especially since areas with a high proportion of older residents have been targeted.

Trading Standards advice is to always say no to cold callers. The Safetrader scheme can help you find a trader in your area, contact 0303 333 1111 or go to www.safetrader.org.uk

Cheap car insurance scam

Social media users are asked to be on the alert for potential scam car insurance brokers. The adverts hook you in with promises of cheap deals and positive reviews. On speaking to the broker, they seem professional and well informed. The quote comes back much less than others you may have obtained, even with the brokers fee included. If the deal looks too good to be true, be very wary. This could be a 'ghost broker' and you could be paying for worthless cover. To get the reduced price the broker will alter some of the policy details such as changing your address or claims history, which will void the cover and potentially mean you are driving uninsured. Use reputable sources to find car insurance deals, don't rely on social media adverts. Insurance companies and intermediaries should be registered with the Financial Conduct Authority www.fca.org.uk.

Beware PayPal phishing email

The emails warn that your account has been suspended, ask you to confirm your email or claim that you've added a new phone number. The email may appear genuine, but scammers often mask their email address, known as spoofing. On clicking a link in the email, you could be asked for details which may help the scammer to access your account.

Health and Safety in **Construction Programme**

This course is aimed at individuals who require a CSCS labouring card to get a job within the Construction Industry but don't currently have the required qualifications.

On successful completion of the course you will gain two accredited certificates and a score report:

- AIM Qualifications Suite of Vocational Pathways Qualifications (AIMVOCs) in Construction and Building – Extended Award Level 1
- AIM Qualifications Health and Safety in a Construction Environment Level 1
- CITB Health, Safety and Environment Score Report

Once you have achieved all assessments, we can then apply for your CSCS labouring card.

During the course you will demonstrate and develop your understanding of:

- Working in the Construction Industry
- Principles of risk assessment
- Working at height
- General health risks in a construction environment
- Principles of Building, Construction and Communication
- · Safe manual handling
- Using equipment safely

The course, including tests and card, are FREE for students who are unemployed and claiming an eligible benefit such as Universal Credit. It is also free for people who are working and on a low income. Other conditions apply, please enquire for more details. Contact details below.

Courses and tests will be at our test centre, The Waterside Centre in Accrington. If you are working and require a CSCS card we can also help with relevant information.

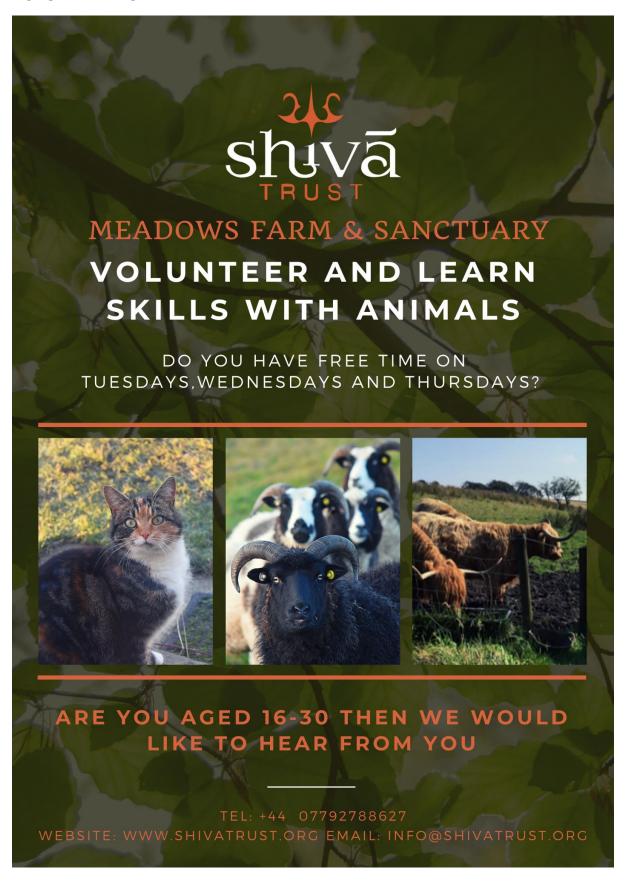
