

Help Shape the Fund

An ongoing consultation is taking place on the Scout Moor Wind Farm Community Wealth Fund, coordinated by Groundwork. This is an important opportunity for local residents and organisations to influence how the fund is designed and delivered.

More than 100 people have already attended drop-in sessions, but so far only around 20 responses have been received via the online survey. Groundwork is keen to hear from more people to ensure the fund reflects local priorities.

The consultation is seeking views on:

How the fund should be governed and managed

What local priorities the fund should support

How local people could be involved in decision-making





Every month we also run a super draw too where you have the chance of winning some fantastic prizes.



What Happens To The Rest?

The remaining 40p goes to towards the prizes, running costs and VAT.

How Many Causes Can I Support?

As many as you like! For example, you could support 1 cause with £10's worth of tickets (the cause would get 5p), or 10 causes with £1's worth of tickets (each cause would get 50p).

You can support every month via Direct Debit. We also offer one-off debit card payment options of either 1, 3, 6 or 12 months.






