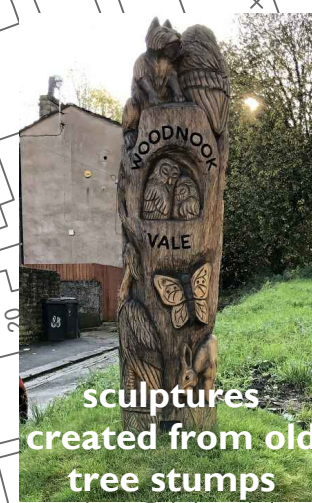

Notes

- measured waymarkers /nature trail to be installed around the wider park
- paths to be upgraded and improved to give accessibility for all
- heritage of the park to be included through artwork and interpretation
- new trees to be introduced to the park to increase year round colour and interest with autumn colour, spring flowers and decorative bark
- improve drainage around the wider park as a whole
- minor repairs around the stone walls around the wider park
- park boundaries to be strengthened with kneerail and gates at entrances where required

Open Space
open grassed area below the tennis courts to be drained and improved to provide open space for events and activities

Tree Stumps
stumps from felled trees to be dug up and used for features such as picnic tables, sculptures and informal play

Entrance
new signage and waymarker at entrance to the Park

Play Area
existing play area to be retained and adjacent former bowling green to be retained as family friendly open space for picnics and games

Entrance
new signage and waymarker at entrance to the Park

Bridleway
bridleway to be resurfaced

Wheeled Sports Area / MUGA
Fully replace existing wheeled sports area with new facility
Improve MUGA through cleaning surface and installing second goal end
Access to area to be improved to prevent access by motorbikes/scramblers and to limit water running onto the surface

Football Pitch
aspiration to upgrade and improve existing kickabout area with new drainage and levelling

Entrance
new signage and waymarker at entrance to park

Wildflowers
area extensively planted with wildflowers and maintained for biodiversity with mown grass paths

Cobbled Path
existing path to be maintained

Tennis Courts / Sports Area
two new, surfaced and fenced courts to be created on original site of tennis courts - marked out for other sports such as squash and cricket

Adult Gym
create new adult gym within the park below tennis courts

Pentanque / Boules
creation of pentanque (boules) area alongside tennis courts

Natural Play
use of tree trunks and boulders to create natural informal play in wooded area

Community Growing Area
raised beds and growing area for the community for fruit, veg, herbs and flowers; a place for the community to meet

Dog Signage
new signage around the wider Park to encourage responsible dog ownership and suggest areas where dogs can be let off the lead

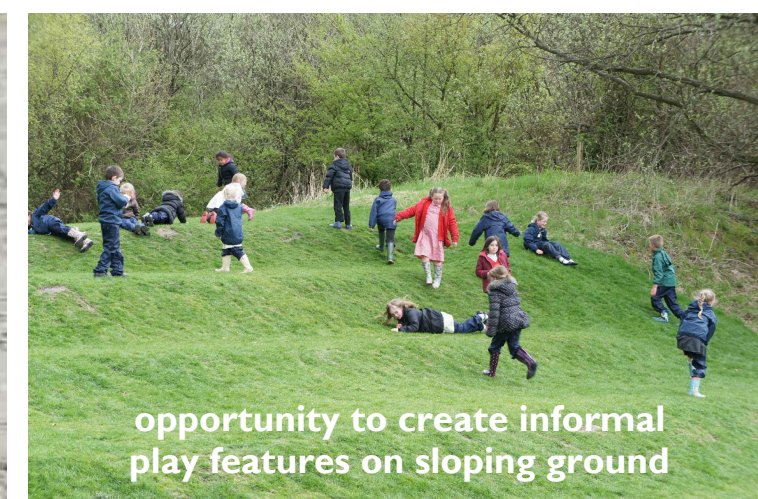
Picnic Area
flat area of former bowling green to be turned into an exciting picnic area using old tree stumps to create the seating and tables
Drainage to be improved around the area

Seating
existing seating along the path to be refurbished and additional seating installed at either side of the path

Entrance
new signage and waymarker at entrance to the Park to formalise and welcome people into the park



pentanque (boules) area created alongside tennis courts



opportunity to create informal play features on sloping ground

Entrance
new signage and waymarker at entrance to the Park and new decorative gate installed to replace the vehicular barrier

Play area
potential to upgrade existing play facilities to provide more challenging and existing activities for older children and teens as well as a cycle track for children to learn to ride bikes

Heritage
history and heritage of the Park to be celebrated and shared with interpretation and with sculpture/feature on site of old Hall

Wildflowers
area extensively planted with shade tolerant wildflowers and maintained for biodiversity with mown grass paths

Woodland Walk
new woodland walk created between Park Road and Wales Road and around all wooded areas



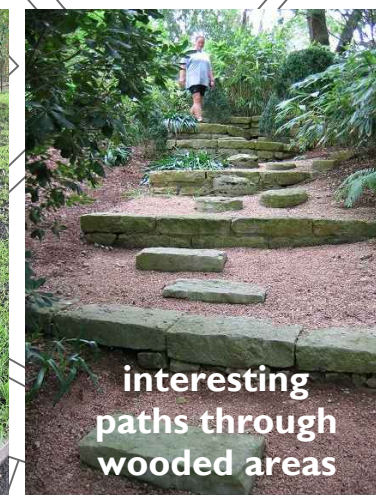
